(a) All employment in excess of 61 hours in any week (including Sunday) in Summer.

(b) All employment in excess of 58 hours in any week (including Sunday) in

Winter.

(c) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman, but so that:—

(i) no employment in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock shall rank as overtime employment under this

paragraph; and

(ii) the said paragraph shall not apply in the case of any workman who under an agreement with his employer is entitled in each half-year either to one week's holiday on full pay or to payment of double pay for one week's work.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the expression "employment in Summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in Winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

6. For the purpose of the application of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

7. This Order shall come into operation

on the first day of March, 1920.
