of people, and carrying off many Men, Women and Children priloners: Matual Complaints having been made of thele Violencies, care is taking on both fides to prevent the like for the future, and to fecure the Peace between the Empires, which by these practiles may otherwise run a great hazard.

Danzzig. Novemb. 24. From Warfare we are informed that the Affembly of the States of Poland is carrie ion as yet with much quietnels, nothing extraordinary having happened therein, unleis that one of the Deputies from Pruffis exhibited a large acculation sgainft the Prince Radqville, which he endeavoured to enforce to his exclusion from the Dyet ; but the Prince had fo well juftlifed himfelf before the Affembly, and purged himfelf from all the complaints brought againft him, that the whole Affembly declared themfelves fully fatisfied as to his innocency, and so highly incenfed againft his Accufer, that they have sufpended him from his voyce and suffrage in the Affembly.

A motion has been made in the Diet for an Oath to be propoled to all the Deputies in that Affembly, to oblidge them, that in their future nomination of a Succeffor to the Crown they shall not regard any other then the publick Interest, nor make any difference between a stranger or one of their own Country, but impartially to give their voice for such perfor as they shall judge most worthy and best qualified for the service of the publick. Upon this motion the Patatines of Sandomire and Gracovy flood up, defining that an exception might be made of the Prince of Conde, who had by his vigorous folicitations and large offers of money, endeavoured to bya's several members of that Affembly.

The fame Letters inform us, that the Coffacks having depoled their General Dorofenfeo from his Command, had elected another in his room, and were marching with an Army of 100-thousand men against the Muscovitos, whole Army 'twas believed consisted of double that number.

Paris, Dec 5. His Majefly is lately gone to Verfailles, where he intends to divert himfelf for two or three dayes, and after wards to return lither for the paffing of feveral Declarations in Parliament, for the fupprefilion of the Chambers of Edict of Paris and Rouen, and the taking away feveral Charges and Offices created fince the year 1635. A Regulation is likewife to be made in the Aids, Gabe's, and in the 5 Gro's Farmes; from which latter 'tis faid all fuch perfons as are found to be of the Reformed Religion, fhall be excluded.

From Lille we are told, that the Sieur Barillon one of His Majesties Commissioners for the Examinations of the Dependencies on his late Conquests, is not yet arrived 3 but that the Conference is all eady opened with the Spanish Gommissioners by the Sieur Courtin, who has put in a claim to the City of Halle and all the Town of Niesport, referving to himself a power to put in his Claim also to all other His Majesties Pretensions.

Several Bourreaux are lately establisht by His Majesties Order to enquire into the Revenues of Religious Houses thorowout His Majesties Dominions; in which are to prefide Mession de Morangis, de Lesseau, d'Aligre and Pussor, who are to be assisted by the Masters of Requests.

quefts. A Courrier fome dayes fince difpatcht hence to Barcellona, isnewly returned, informing us that Don Juan Itill continues there, where he is entertained and treated with much Civility, and that by Order from the Queen Regent; fo that 'tis hoped all things may be friendly compoled with fatiffaction on all fides.

Hague, Decemb. 6. The Commander of Ifendick has lately made a Complaint to the States that a party of 8 Spaniards came lately to the Church of a Village near adjoyning, called Oudeman, under the Holland Juridiction ; where were affembled a Congregation of those of the Reformed Religion with their Minister : where speaking infuriously against their Religion, they hurt several of the people, pulling down the Minister , wounding him in 7 or Splaces of his body, to the great hazard of his life; and

cutting off one of his Ears, and afterwards ftripping the people of both fexes, carried away their Cloaths. Complaint is hereupon ordered to be made of this Infoluency to the Spanish Ambasiadour and to the Conftable of Caffille, the Governour of the Spanish Netherlands; defiring that justice may be done upon the Offenders, and a ftridt onquiry and fearch made for their apprehension; in the mean time 'tis faid that the permission formerly given to the Romissin Priefts for the exercise of their Religion, is to be revoked; and fuch of them as shall be found in the flat Countrey, feffed and fecured, till reparation be made for the aforefaid fact.

Upon the addreffes made to the States by the Company of the Eaft-Indy Merchants for the renewing and continuance of their Charter, the States have had feveral Debates upon the point, and appear inclinable to favour them, and 'tis believed will renue their Patent for the Term defired : they have also promiled to affift them in obtaining fatisfaction of their Demands upon Portugal : but first expect what Overtures may be made by Don France for de Melo, who is in little time expected here under the Character of Ambaffadour.

The Spanish Ambafladour has in the name of the Conflable of Caffille, defired leave that 100 shouland pound weight of Salt-Peter, and half that quantity of Salphur, may be transported out of the Territories of the States of the United Provinces into the Spanish Netherlands, withour payment of Custom; which is believed will be granted, up on confideration of a kindnels of the lame nature formerly granted to the States by the Marquils de Caffel Rodrige, for the free transportation of all materials for the founding of Cannon at Malines for the fervice of the States.

The nomination of the Heer Laniel Van Wjagaerden Lord of H'erkendam Mosrmont, G'e to be feut Aurba adourinto France, is approved of by he States General; and he is accordingly preparing his Train and Equipage, in o der to that Employment.

Amsterdam, Decemb 7. The Armes of Amsterdam, a flour Merchant ship intended for the Pesi-Indies, and thought to have been cast away, is put i..., Geerge, having not received any other injury than the loss f her Mast. Our Letters from Legern inform us the Corf is of Algier have lately feifed two riolland Flutes, 4 Hambourgar., and 2 Portuguele ; ine of them laden from Erafille w1 u Sugars and Tobacco to a considerable value : and that 16 of their men of war were out at les.

From Cadiz we are informed, that on the 5 th paft the Commander Van der Zaen, arrived there with his Squadron, but had not then had the fortune to have met with any of the Turks men of war.

Weymouth, Now. 28. Several Vessels are this week departed from this Port, intending for Portugal and France. The 26 inftant arrived here one thip from Of^2 end, one from the Ifles of Guernsey and Fersey, one from Cherburg in France, and another from St. Malo's; the two last laden with Linnen, by whom we have advice that at Cherburg is lately launched a small Freg. to 200 Tune for the Kingsfervice. They tell us that at Bress is newly launched a great Man of war, which is to carry 120 Guns, which is well answers expectation, that Order is given to put two others immediately upon the Stocks of the fame fize.

Deat, Nov. 29. The 27th inftant arrived in the Downs, three flips bound for the East-Indies, where they as yet continue with several other Merchant flips outwards bound for several parts, Yesterday towards the Evening were forced into the Down's by contrary winds and foul weather about 23 fail of Dutch Merchant flips, all of them outwards bound i and this day appeared a Man of War their Convoyer, expecting a more favourable season.

Deal, Nov. 30. This Afternoon the English and Dutch Merchant ships which were riding in the Downs, set fail, all of them outwards bound : but the wind since changing, we believe they will be again forced back to their station.

On Saturday Night last was cast away at out he Brake-Head off the North-Foreland, a fl ip of 5 or 600 Tuns, believed to be a Dutch thip ; all her men supposed to be lost with the Vessel.
