W HEREAS by the Summer Time Act, 1916, as amended by the Time (Ireland) Act, 1916, it is provided that during the prescribed period in each year in which the former Act is in force the time for general purposes is to be one hour in advance of Greenwich Mean Time; and it is further provided that His Majesty may, in any year subsequent to the year 1916, by Order in Council made during the continuance of the present War, declare the former Act to be in force during that year, and in such case the prescribed period for that year shall be such period as may be fixed by Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the Summer Time Act, 1916, as so amended as aforesaid, shall be in force during the year 1920, and the prescribed period in that year shall be from two o'clock in the morning Greenwich Mean Time on Sunday, the 28th day of March, until two o'clock in the morning Greenwich Mean Time on Monday, the 27th day of September.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it is enacted by the Suspensory Act, 1914, that notwithstanding anything in the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, no steps shall be taken to put that Act into operation until the expiration of twelve months from the date of the passing of that Act, or, if at the expiration of those twelve months the present War has not ended, until such later date (not being later than the end of the present War) as may be fixed by His Majesty by Order in Council; and that the provisions of that Act shall have effect accordingly:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 14th day of September, 1915, His Majesty was pleased to order that no steps should be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of eighteen months from the date of the passing of that Act, unless the present War had previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of those eighteen months the present War had not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as might thereafter be fixed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1916, to extend by six months the time mentioned in the said Order of the 14th day of September, 1915, and by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1916, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 13th day of March, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 22nd day of August, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 27th day of February, 1918, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council of the 4th day of September, 1918, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council of the 12th day of March, 1919, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council of the 18th day of August, 1919, to extend that time by a further period of six months:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further the time mentioned in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that:—

No steps shall be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act. 1914, into operation until the expiration of a period of six months after the termination of the eighteen months and eight periods of six months mentioned in the recited Orders, unless the present War has previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of that period the present War has not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council.

W HEREAS by Section 23 of the Finance Act, 1917, it is provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare—

' (a) that under the law in force in any of His Majesty's possessions excess profits duty is chargeable in respect of any profits in respect of which excess profits duty is alsopayable in the United Kingdom; and

payable in the United Kingdom; and
(b) that arrangements have been made
with the Government of any such possession
whereby, in respect of any profits, only the
duty which is kigher in amount is to be payable, and the amount of such duty is to be
apportioned between the respective Exchequers in proportion to the amount of duty
which would otherwise have been payable in
the United Kingdom and in that possession
respectively:

And whereas by Section 20 (1) of the War Taxation and Excess Profits Duty Ordinance, 1918, of Southern Rhodesia it was provided that there should be charged, levied and collected a duty of 40 per cent. of the amount of excess profits which had been received by or had accrued to or in favour of any person during the year ended the 31st day of March, 1918, provided that should the duty so leviable upon any person in respect of any accounting period not exceed the income tax payable by the same person in respect of the same accounting period under the provisions of Chapter 11 of that Ordinance, then such income tax only should be payable, provided also that in the event of the provisions of Section 23 of the Imperial Finance Act, 1917, being applied to that Territory, such duty should be charged, levied and collected in terms thereof:

And whereas by Section 69 of the said Ordinance "Territory" means Southern Rhodesia:

And whereas by Section 34 of the Finance Act, 1919, it is provided that Section 23 of the Finance Act, 1917 (which provides for relief in respect of Colonial excess profits duty), shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as though references to His Majesty's possessions included references to any territory under His Majesty's protection:

And whereas the said territory is under the protection of His Majesty:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in Southern Rhodesia:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue and exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Finance Act, 1917, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that under the law in force in Southern Rhodesia excess profits duty was chargeable during the year ended the 31st March, 1918, in respect of profits in respect of which excess profits duty was also payable in the United Kingdom, and that arrangements have been made with the Government of Southern Rhodesia whereby, in respect

of any profits for the said year, only the duty which is higher in amount is to be payable, and that the amount of such duty is to be apportioned between the respective Exchequers in proportion to the amount of duty which would otherwise have been payable in the United Kingdom and Southern Rhodesia respectively:

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:-

- (1) That the following headings should be deleted:
 - (A) Boats and Craft;
 - (A) Uniform Clothing, Naval, Military and Air Force;
 - (A) Vessels;
 - (A) Whalebone;
 - (A) Whale fins;

Provisions and Victuals which may be used as Food for Man or Cattle, the following:-

(A) Cakes and Meals (which may be used as forage or food for animals) the follow-

Husk Meal;

Linseed Cake and Meal;

Maize Germ Meal; Maize Meal and Flour;

- (A) Fish, except the following: -Tinned, preserved or frozen fish, chinchards, sprats; herrings, crayfish, prawns, and lobsters;
- (A) Salmon tinned; (A) Meat of all kinds, except turtle meat, horseflesh, and except tinned or potted meat, other than tinned bacon and ham;
 - (A) Sausages, except tinned sausages.
- (2) That the following headings should be added:---
- (A) Vessels of 15 tons gross and over; Provisions and Victuals which may be used as Food for Man or Cattle, the following:-
 - (A) Cakes and Meals (which may be used as forage or food for animals) the following:

Husk Meal; Maize Germ Meal:

Maize Meal and Flour;

(A) Fish, except the following: -Tinned, preserved or frozen fish, chinchards, crabs, oysters, sprats, herrings, crayfish, prawns, shrimps, scallops, lobsters and fresh salmon;

(A) Salmon, tinned;

(A) Bacon and Ham, including Tinned Bacon and Ham;

(A) Fresh and Frozen Meat of all kinds, except Turtle Meat, Horseflesh and Offals;

(A) Sausages, Pork, except Tinned Pork Sausages.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into considera tion, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and

govern themselves accordingly.

The following Statute, made by the Governing Body of University College, Oxford, on the 23rd day of January, 1920, has been sub-mitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Ex parte, the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, in the

University of Oxford.

A Statute to amend Statute III. (the Fellows) of the College Statutes and Appendix II., being the Ordinance in relation to the Bye-Fellowship of the Foundation of the Right Honourable Mary Anne Viscountess Sid-. mouth, called the Stowell Civil Law Fellowship, framed under the Universities of Oxford

and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows of University College, being the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose and holden on Saturday, the 13th day of December, 1919; and further by adjournments on Thursday, the 15th, and Friday, the 23rd of January, 1920, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present and voting and submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas it is expedient to render the Bye-Fellowship in the College, known as the Stowell Civil Law Fellowship, and hitherto regarded merely as a Prize-Fellowship, also available for the purposes of an official Fellowship charged with educational duties, and to assimilate it still further in status and emoluments to the ordinary Fellowships in the College, while maintaining the general intentions of the said Mary Anne Viscountess Sidmouth as expressed in a certain indenture, bearing date June 26th, 1837, namely, to record the name of her father, William Lord Stowell, in connection with the Civil Law and with the University of Oxford.

Now, therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, in virtue of the powers conferred upon us by section 54 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by Statute XI. of the Statutes of the College, and by clause 12 of the said Ordinance in relation to the Stowell Civil Law Fellowship, do alter and amend the said Ordinance and also Statute III., clauses 17 and 23, in the following manner:—

- 1. In clause 2 of the Ordinance in relation to the Bye-Fellowship of the foundation of the Right Honourable Mary Anne Viscountess Sidmouth set forth in Appendix II. to the College Statutes we insert before the words "No person" the following words: "Except as hereinafter provided in the case of a Fellow elected under clause 3 of this Ordinance."
- 2. We strike out all the words of clause 3 and substitute the following words: "Whenever the Bye-Fellowship be or fall vacant, then, if the Master and Fellows of the College at any General Meeting shall by resolution declare that it is expedient to elect as Stowell Civil Law Fellow a person eminenty qualified to be a Lecturer, or Praelector, or Tutor, and to give instruction in the College on the Civil Law and the subjects recognized in the examinations conducted under the supervision of the Board of the Faculty of Law in the University, they shall thereupon proceed, as soon thereafter as conveniently may be, to elect such a person as Stowell Civil Law Fellow, provided that the election shall be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Statute III, clauses 11 and 19; and the person so elected shall be elected for a period of seven years, and shall be re-eligible thereafter from time to time for such period not exceeding seven years as the Master and Fellows shall on each occasion determine and shall receive a fixed emolument (including the income arising from Viscountess Sidmouth's endowment) of £200 per annum free of income tax, as Fellow, together with such stipend from the Tuition Fund, as Lecturer, or Praelector, or Tutor, as the Master and Fellows shall from time to time

- determine, and shall be governed in respect of vacation of the Fellowship, Residence, Service and Pension, by the provisions of Statute III., clauses 13 to 18, 20, 21 and Statute IV., clause 2, and not by the subsequent provisions of this Ordinance.
- 3. We amend clause 4 by insenting before the words, "the intellectual qualifications," the words here following: "Whenever the Bye-Fellowship shall fall vacant, if within a period of six months the Master and Fellows shall have passed no such resolution, or if at any General Meeting they shall declare by resolution that the Bye-Fellowship shall for the ensuing election be regarded as a Prize-Fellowship, then an election thereto shall be made by the Master and Fellows as soon thereafter as conveniently may be and on such day as they at any of their meetings shall appoint; and notice of the intended election shall be given by the said Master, in such manner as he shall deem best adapted to secure publicity, thirty days at least before the day of election."
- 4. In Statute III., clause 17, after the word "Tutor" we insert the words: "and likewise any Stowell Civil Law Fellow, if elected, or re-elected, under clause 3 of the Ordinance set forth in Appendix II. to these Statutes."
- 5. In Statute III., clause 23, at the end, we add the words: "except as expressly provided in clause 3 of the said Ordinance."

We, the Master or Keeper and Fellows and Scholars of Jesus College, in the University of Cambridge, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:—

By substituting in Section 6 of Statute IX., intituled "Of the Scholars to be maintained in the College" the words one hundred pounds for the words eighty pounds.

(GREAT BRITAIN).

OVERTIME RATES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES), EFFECTIVE AS FROM 1ST MARCH, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirtmaking Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 26th December, 1913, having given due notice on 24th November, 1919, of Proposal to Fix Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, hereby give notice that they have fixed Overtime Rates under Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to apply in respect of Male and Female Workers employed in the trade, whether engaged on Timework or Piece-work, and the Overtime Rates fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 24th February, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Overtime Rates fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 1st March 1920,* as the date from which such Overtime Rates shall become effective.

*Note.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 7th March, 1920.

SCHEDULE. Part I.

Minimum Rates for Overtime, Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week 48
On any day (other than Saturday) ... 9
On Saturday 5

And that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours as set out above shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-Quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.
- 2. For the second two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Over-

time Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-Half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

3: For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for Overtime after the first four hours' Overtime on any other day, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

Provided that:—(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 91.

ceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

Note.—The hours which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART II.

The above Overtime Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Shirt-making) Order, 1913 (that is to say, the making from textile fabrics of shirts, pyjamas, aprons, and other washable clothing, worn by male persons, excluding articles the making of which is included in paragraph 1 of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and excluding articles which are knitted or made from knitted fabrics), but which are not engaged in the making of handkerchiefs, neckties, scarves, mufflers, gloves, socks, stockings, spats, gaiters, hats, caps (other than chefs' caps and hospital ward caps), infants' millinery, baby linen, and such articles of clothing as are made for children without distinction of sex.

Provided that the Overtime Rates set out in this Schedule shall not apply to:—

 Any male or female workers engaged merely as Clerks, Messengers, Salesmen or Saleswomen, Travellers, or Persons engaged in cleaning premises.

2. Any female workers engaged in work ordinarily carried on in a Stock-room or Warehouse, or as Packers.

3. Any male or female workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the classes of workers specified in paragraph 1 of this Proviso and any female workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the classes of workers specified in paragraph 2 of this Proviso.

PART III.

Section I.—The above Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act

to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident

Section II.—The above Overtime Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Order.

1. The Oxfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," is modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Area.

- 2.—(1.) The provisions of the principal Order shall apply without modification, except as authorised in the Oxfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 2), to the area described in the First Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Area.
- (2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Provision as to movement for slaughter into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in the Prohibited Area.

3.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway without a licence from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to foot-and-mouth disease to a railway station in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area, and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a scheduled district for the purposes of an Order of the Minister relating to footand-mouth disease to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not situate in the Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the

'slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Scheduled District excluding the Prohibited Area.

4. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises

other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

- (2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.
- (3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.
- (4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.
- (5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an Officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6) A movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like

(7) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destina-

.....: :

tion is situate.

Movement through the Prohibited Area by Rail.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

8. Nothing in this Order shall be construed

as authorising:-

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-

mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Minister.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Minister, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Minister for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).

-(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District, except in the prohibited Area, if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale

authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of this Order.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order—
"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"The Ministry" means the Ministry of

Agriculture and Fisheries.

Animals " means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

"Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in

the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.
