WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all factories and workshops situated in the counties of Norfolk and Suffolk in which the processes of gutting, salting and packing of herring are carried on.

Copies of the draft Order may be obtained on application to the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Any objection to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within twenty-one days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing, and must state:—

- (a) the requirements in the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as set out in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—*Female Workers.*

Workers of 18 years of age and upwards, 32s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 24s. per week.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 21s. per week.

Workers under 15 years of age, 17s. per week.

SECTION II.—*Male Workers.*

Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 54s. per week.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 46s. per week.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 42s. per week.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 38s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 24s. per week.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 21s. per week.

Workers under 15 years of age, 17s. per week.

SECTION III.

The weekly rates set out in Sections I. and II. above are based on a week of 48 hours and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

Provided that in the case of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, where the normal number of hours per week in the establishment as agreed between the employer and his workers is less than 48, but not less than 44:

(i) The weekly wage payable for such shorter normal working week shall be not less

than the weekly rates set out in Sections I. and II. of this Part of this Schedule.

(ii) The weekly rate set out in Sections I. and II. of this Part of this Schedule shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than the agreed normal number of hours in the establishment.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

Section I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be:—

In any week, 48.

On any day, the number agreed for this purpose between an employer and his workers or a Trade Union acting on behalf of such workers, but so that the aggregate number does not exceed 48 in the week.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.

The Trade Board propose to Fix Overtime Rates in respect of male and female workers to apply in respect of hours worked by a worker whether employed on time-work or on piece-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time and a Quarter, that is to say, One and a Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(b) For all Overtime after the completion of two hours' Overtime on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time and a Half, that is to say, One and a Half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Time and a Quarter for the first two hours, and Time and a Half thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

Section III.

The provisions set out in this Part of this Schedule are without prejudice to any agreement between an employer and his workers, providing for the payment at Overtime Rates of all hours in excess of the normal number of hours in the establishment, notwithstanding

that such normal number of hours is less than 48 per week.

Note.—The hours which female workers and young persons are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of scutched flax, (b) of hemp, (c) of a mixture of scutched flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

Including:—

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

but excluding:—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

PART IV.

Section I.

The above General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.

The above Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 6th March, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 5) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") shall apply only to the Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be the Scheduled District for the purposes of the principal Order.

*Control and Muzzling of Dogs in certain
Inner Controlled Areas.*

2.—(1) A dog in an Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "an Inner Controlled Area," shall at all times

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; and

(b) whilst in or on any other place be—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle:

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

(3) Article 4 of the principal Order shall not apply to an Inner Controlled Area.

(4) Any dog found in an Inner Controlled Area in respect of which the provisions of this Article as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs*), which Article shall apply accordingly.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of Inner
Controlled Areas.*

3.—(1) No dog shall be moved out of an Inner Controlled Area unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Minister authorising such movement and signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Minister may think necessary or desirable and shall be speci-

fied in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Article.

Offences.

4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 3 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Revocation of Orders.

6. The Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 6, 7, 10, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18) and the Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Orders of 1920 and of 1920 (No. 2) are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty,

3. No vessel is to anchor or trawl within 100 yards of a line drawn from the north-eastern corner of the prohibited area off Gilkicker point in a 7° (N. 22° E. Mag.) direction to the shore.

4. No vessel or boat of any description is to anchor or kedge within 100 yards either side of a line joining the two buoys situated respectively 600 yards, 259° (N. 86° W. Mag.), and 600 yards, 246° (S. 81° W. Mag.), from the centre of St. Helen's fort

II. REGULATIONS REGARDING FISHING VESSELS.

1. Fishing vessels are required to follow the Admiralty Orders for British Fishing vessels dated 7th January, 1919, and subsequent Orders.

Notice is hereby given that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

II.—REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO FISHERMEN.

The following Regulations are to be complied with by all fishing vessels and boats on the coast of England and Wales from Portland bill westwards to Bardsey island (hereinafter referred to as the South-Western Area).

2. By day and night trawling is prohibited in the areas formed by lines joining the following positions:—

- (a) *On the North* The parallel of lat. $50^{\circ} 03' N.$
On the South: The parallel of lat. $49^{\circ} 59' N.$
On the East: The meridian of long. $5^{\circ} 25' W.$
On the West: The meridian of long. $5^{\circ} 35' W.$
- (b) *On the North*: The coast.
On the South: The parallel of lat. $49^{\circ} 50' N.$
On the East: The meridian of long. $5^{\circ} 06' W.$
On the West: The meridian of long. $5^{\circ} 15' W.$
- (c) *On the North*: The parallel of lat. $50^{\circ} 17' N.$
On the South: The parallel of lat. $50^{\circ} 12' N.$
On the East: The meridian of long. $4^{\circ} 00' W.$
On the West: The meridian of long. $4^{\circ} 09' W.$
- (d) *On the North*: The parallel of lat. $50^{\circ} 13' 30'' N.$
On the South: The parallel of lat. $50^{\circ} 07' 30'' N.$
On the East: The meridian of long. $3^{\circ} 34' W.$

On the West: The meridian of long. $3^{\circ} 50' W.$

III.—PLYMOUTH.

PART I.—MOVEMENTS WITHIN THE PORT.

1. The movements of all merchant ships, fishing vessels, or boats of any kind, are subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, for the Sound, and the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, for the Hamoaze, whose orders are to be immediately obeyed.

Approach to Government Vessels and Establishments.

2. No merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) will be allowed to approach any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government Dockyard or Establishment, without special permission.

Prohibited Areas.

3. When anchoring, care must be taken to be well clear of the fairway.

Mount Batten Breakwater.—All small craft are warned that they should not approach within 200 yards of Mount Batten breakwater, it being necessary to keep this area clear for seaplanes going out and returning.

Fishing is permitted by night in Whitsand bay, subject to the following regulations:—

(a) No fishing at night is to take place east of a line drawn in a 231° (*S. 67° W. Mag.*) direction from Rame head.

(b) Except on Sundays, no night fishing is to take place within three miles of the coast between Tregantle and Portwrinkle up to the hour of 12 midnight, or such later hour as may be ordered.

4. A limited number of moorings for yachts may be laid in the following places and nowhere else:—

On West Hoe—on application to King's Harbour Master, Plymouth; in the Cattewater above Turnchapel—on application to the Harbour Master of Cattewater.

PART II.—VESSELS LEAVING THE PORT.

Prohibition.

5. Merchant vessels (including those engaged in the coastal trade) must on no account leave the Dockyard ports of Devonport and Plymouth without permission.

Vessels in the Hamoaze must obtain such permission from the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, at his office in the Dockyard; those at berths in the waters of the sound, Cawsand bay, Cattewater, Sutton pool, or Milbay docks must obtain permission from the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, at Longroom, Stonehouse.

It is also necessary for ships to obtain permission from the Collector of Customs, at the Barbican, Plymouth.

PART III.—BOOM DEFENCE AND NAVIGATION OF NARROW WATERS.

6. A mooring-buoy, which is situated 286° (*N. 58° W. Mag.*), 575 yards from Cremyll obelisk, is now being used by two vessels; these vessels being moored out of the fairway, no lights will be displayed on them by night, and all vessels and boats are cautioned to keep well clear of them.

7. Vessels are warned to pay strict attention to Clause 9, Order in Council, 4th September, 1918, Regulations for the Dockyard Ports of

Plymouth and Devonport, and no merchant vessel, whether navigating with or against the tide, is to attempt to pass a man-of-war in the "Narrows" when she is flying the "Red Ensign" over "M" Commercial by day, or a red light by night, at the fore truck (see Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1209 of 1918).

A vessel navigating against the tide should ease her engines and wait until any other vessel going with the tide has passed clear.

The following signals are hoisted at Mount Wise, Longroom, and South dockyard signal station:—

Signal and Signification.

Ball over Red Burgee.—Large ships coming from Sound to Hamoaze; all traffic outwards between Rubble bank and Melampus light-buoy is to cease while this signal is flying.

Red Burgee over Ball.—Large ships coming from Hamoaze to Sound; all traffic inwards between Melampus light-buoy and Rubble bank is to cease while this signal is flying.

It must be clearly understood that when either of the above signals is hoisted, no merchant vessel is allowed to be under way within the limits defined hereunder, unless permission has previously been obtained from the Naval authorities.

Limits.

The Northern limit is a line drawn 90° and 270° (*S. 74° E. Mag.*) and (*N. 74° W. Mag.*) through the north Rubble buoy, and the Southern limit is a line joining Dunstone point and Melampus light-buoy.

Ordinary Port Regulations.

8. The ordinary Regulations of the Port, except as affected by this Notice, are to be strictly adhered to.

Variation.—16° W.

Note.—This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Grocery and Provisions Trade (that is to say).—

1. The retail sale of any of the articles specified in Schedule I in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which:—

(a) twelve or more of such articles are sold or exposed for sale whether or not the sale of such articles is the main business in the establishment or business or branch or department; or

(b) the retail sale of any one or more of such articles is the main or principal business of that establishment or business or branch or department.

2. The wholesale sale (except when incidental to manufacture or production) of any of the articles specified in Schedule II in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which such sale is the main or principal business of that establishment, business, branch, or department.

3. The sale of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with the sales specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 above

if such sale involves the employment of workers who are also employed in those sales; including the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the sales specified in 1, 2 or 3 above:

- (i) checking, testing, grading;
- (ii) weighing, measuring;
- (iii) packeting, boxing, bundling, bagging, parcelling, packing, unpacking, labelling;
- (iv) collecting, despatching, delivering;
- (v) stock-keeping, warehousing, storing, cold storing, refrigerating;
- (vi) portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating;
- (vii) timekeeping, cleaning premises;
- (viii) adjusting implements, cleaning implements, utensils or receptacles;
- (ix) cleaning goods;
- (x) window or show-case dressing;
- (xi) garaging, horse or motor keeping, cleaning vehicles;
- (xii) mixing, blending, crushing, grinding, mincing, shredding, cutting;
- (xiii) sausage making, bacon processing, ham processing, ham boiling, ham or bacon curing;
- (xiv) roasting coffee, blanching almonds;
- (xv) cooking, preparing or serving food or drink for consumption by the public on or off the premises by workers principally engaged in the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3, above;

- (d) operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;
- (e) Post Office business;
- (f) operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917;
- (g) operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters;
- (h) sales and operations incidental thereto covered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.
