HE King arrived yesterday in the Maese, and landed about 7 a clock in the evening at Oraniepolder; and having refreshed himself at Monsieur Reynenburgh's House at Naswick, His Majesty came hither about Midnight, where His Majesty designs to stay on-

Bruffels, May 16. N.S. The Troops on both fides are now in motion, in order to take the Field. The Prince de Vaudemont went hence yesterday for Flanders, where the Army will in few days be brought together, which he is to command under His Majesty; a Camp being already marked out for them at Gaure, upon the Schelde, between Guens and Audenarde. Another Body of the Forces of the Allies are ordered to encamp on the fide of Louvain, about two Leagues from that place; feveral Battalions are already arrived there, and the Brandenburg Troops are marching thither. Letters from the Frontiers say, That the Mareschal de Villerry arrived the 9th Instant at Valenciemes, and went the 11th to Mons, where the Mareschal de Boufflers methin: The Army to be commanded by the first, is to Rendezvous between Pont Esperies and Tournay, on the Schelde; and the other Army, which is to act under the Mareichal de Boufflers, has its Rendervous between the Sambre and the Meufe. The French Troops that were lately Canton'd near Dunkliche, are on their March towards the Schelde. Monsieur Diehwelt went hence this day for Holland, to attend His Majesty upon his Arrival from Eng-

Paris, May 14. The late K. James parted from Bologne the 3d of this month, and came the 5th to Sr. Donis, where the late Queen met him; and from thence they went to see the French King at Versailles, and afterwards returned to St. Germains. The Mareschal de Villerey is gone to command the

French Army in Flanders; and the Duke de Chartres, the Duke de Bourbon, and the Prince de Com; will follow in few days. The Duke de Vendofine went hence this week, towards Catalonia. The Mareschal de Joyeuse is gone to command on the Coasts of Normandy; and the Mareschal d'Estree, to Breft. Monsieur de Renaut is sailed with the Frigats under his Command, from Rochelle; and the Marquis de Nesmond, from Brest. They have here no certain Advice of the Thoulon Fleet; but the common Report is, that they have passed the

Francfort, May 13. The Confederate Forces begin to assemble between Eppingken and Sintzheim. Prince Lewis of Baden is expected at Hailbron about

the 16th of this month.

Vienna, May 5. Prince Lewis of Baden went hence the 27th of the last month for Germany. The Elector of Saxony arrived here the 2d of this month. The Imperial Army which His Electoral Highness is to command in Hungary, will be composed of above 60000 Men. General Caprara is to command under him.

Turin, May 1. The Forces of the Allies in these Parts are now marching to their Rendezvous near Demont, where they are to be by the 10th or 12th

of this month.

Vinice, April 27. N.S. The Convoy will fail in few days for the Levant; 2000 Soldiers are already shipped, who are to go thither with this Opportunity.

Weymouth, May 9. The Fleet under the Command of Sir George Rooke, passed by Portland this

morning, to the Westward.

Deale, May 10. Vice-Admiral Aylmer, who artended His Majesty in his Voyage to Holland, returned into the Downes this morning, with the Elizabeth, Lincoln, Burlington, Ruby, and Trident-Prize; and they are now under Sail to the Westward.
