

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays, one-and-a-half times the above minimum rate applicable;

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, twice the above minimum rate applicable;

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, one-and-a-quarter times the above minimum rate applicable, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

PART III.

SECTION I.—The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers as specified in Part I of this Schedule who are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

(a) The manufacture of corsets, stays, children's corset bodices, infants' stay bands, bust confiners, such as brassieres and bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.

(b) The manufacture of support or abdominal belts and similar articles except where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of surgical instruments.

(c) The assembling of stocking suspenders in conjunction with or in association with the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

(d) All warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between

employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD. (GREAT BRITAIN.)

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 15th March, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for those branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 15th December, 1919, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for male workers then in operation in respect of certain classes of male workers, hereby give notice, that they have varied the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 22nd November, 1919, in respect of the Classes of male workers as specified in Section I. and Section II. of Part I. of the Schedule set out below, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied are shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 10th March, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 15th March, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 21st March, 1920.
