Female and Male Workers, and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 31st March, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 2nd April, 1920,* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 8th April, 1920.

b) For home workers:-

(i) General Minimum Time-rate, to operate from 2nd April, 1920, to 1st October, 1920, $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

(ii) General Minimum Time-rate, to operate from 2nd October, 1920, to 1st April, 1921, 8d. per hour.

(iii) General Minimum Time-rate, to operate as from 2nd April, 1921, 81d. per hour.

(a) In the case of Female Home-workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time-rate for Home-workers applicable as set out in Section I. (b) of Part I. above.

(b) In the case of all Female Workers, other than Home-workers, employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 9d. an hour to an Ordinary worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and over who have had not less than six months' experience in the

SECTION II.—For all Male Workers.

(i.) Piece-work Basis Time-rate to operate from 2nd April, 1920, to 1st October, 1920, 1s. 2½d, per hour.

(ii.) Piece-work Basis Time-rate to operate from 2nd October, 1920, to 1st April, 1921, 1s. 3d. per hour.

(iii.) Piece-work Basis Time-rate to operate as from 2nd April, 1921, 1s. 4d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piecework basis Time-rate set out above and applic-Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 21 years of age and over who have had not less than six months' experience in the trade.
