

administrative counties of Pembroke, Carmarthen and Cardigan who under an agreement in writing with his employer is entitled either:—

(a) In each year to one fortnight's holiday (or to holidays amounting to 12 week days) on full pay, or

(b) to payment of double pay for a fortnight's work in each year,

the provisions of the Orders of the Wages Board, that all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman shall rank as overtime employment, shall no longer apply.

The Agricultural Wages Board, as required by the above Act and by Paragraph 4 of the above-mentioned Regulations, will consider any objections to the above proposed Order which may be lodged with them within one month from the date of this Notice. The objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.
