**BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.**

*In the Matter of Mendel Fischel.*

*Revocation of Certificate of Naturalisation.*

Whereas I am satisfied as the result of an inquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalisation (Revocation) Committee that Mendel Fischel, to whom a certificate of naturalisation numbered 25409 was granted on the 4th August, 1914, has shown himself by act to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty.

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

And I further direct that Mendel Fischel shall cease to be a British subject.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.  
BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD.  
(GREAT BRITAIN.)

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS FIXED OR  
VARIED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 14th April, 1920.\*

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Brush and Broom Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 12th January, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Piece Rates and to Vary Overtime Rates in respect of Male and Female Piece Workers, hereby give notice as required by Section 2 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Piece Rates for Male Workers for Pan Work, Hairs, Painting Brush Making, Hand Finishing and Bone Brush Making, and for Female Workers for Hand Drawing, and have varied Overtime Rates in respect of all Male and Female Piece Workers as follows:—

The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates otherwise applicable in respect of all hours worked by all Male and Female Piece Workers in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows, subject to the provisions of Section II. of Part III. of the Schedule to the Notice of the Minimum Rates of Wages fixed, dated 31st December, 1919, viz.:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i) For Male Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable, or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate, with the addition in both cases of one-quarter of the General Minimum Time Rate, which under the terms of the Trade Board's Notice dated 31st December, 1919, would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on Time Work.

(ii) For Female Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable, or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 2½d. per hour.

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i) For Male Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable, or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate, with the addition in both cases of one-half of the General Minimum Time Rate which under the terms of the Trade Board's Notice, dated the 31st December, 1919, would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on Time Work.

(ii) For Female Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable, or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 4½d. per hour.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i) For Male Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable, or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate, with the addition in both cases of the General Minimum Time Rate which under the terms of the Trade Board's Notice, dated 31st December, 1919, would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on time work.

(ii) For Female Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable, or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 9½d. per hour.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rates shall be as set out in sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph (a) above for Male and Female Workers respectively, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

And the Trade Board further give Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 12th April, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates, as fixed or as varied, by the

Trade Board, and specifying 14th April, 1920,\* as the date from which such Minimum Rates shall become effective.

\* *Note.* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 20th April, 1920.

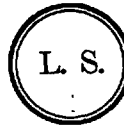
