BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Mendel Fischel.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalisation.

Whereas I am satisfied as the result of an inquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalisation (Revocation) Committee that Mendel Fischel, to whom a certificate of naturalisation numbered 25409 was granted on the 4th August, 1914, has shown himself by act to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty.

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

And I further direct that Mendel Fischel shall cease to be a British subject.
