way Bridge past the Alexandra Public House to the Gibraltar Inn the point of commencement.

6. St. Mary's Ward.

Commence at a point in the centre of the High-street of Chatham where the same is crossed by the Boundary of the Borough and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the High-street to the junction of Clover-street with High-street thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Clover-street to the junction of the same with the New-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the New-road and Chatham Hill to a point in the Boundary of the Bor-ough in the centre of Chatham Hill opposite the thirty-first milestone thence first in a northwesterly direction and thence in a northerly direction along the Boundary of the Borough to the River and thence in a generally southerly direction along the same Boundary to the point of commencement before described.

. The boundaries as above described are more particularly delineated in the Plan which is annexed hereto and forms part of the Scheme.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the fees specified in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be taken accordingly in substitution for the fees specified in the Schedules to the Orders in Council dated the 19th day of July, 1918, and the 11th day of July, 1919.
