SUFFOLK AUDIT DISTRICT.

To Ernest William Hicks, District Auditor;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

The Minister of Health hereby certifies the appointment to the office of District Auditor of Ernest William Hicks (hereinafter referred to

as "the District Auditor"), and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, and the other enactments in that behalf, the Minister hereby Orders and Prescribes as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Authorities, and the Officers of the Authorities, described in the Schedule to this Order, so far as those Accounts are for the time being subject to be audited by a District Auditor.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which is hereby assigned to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Suffolk Audit District," and shall, until the Minister otherwise directs, comprise the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of the several Authorities described in the Schedule to this Order.
