##### DONIBRISTLE AERODROME.

It is hereby notified that:—

The following arrangements have been made at Donibristle Aerodrome, which is about 3 miles N.E. of the Forth Bridge, and 9 miles N.W. of Edinburgh:—

A new wind direction indicator in the form of a white aeroplane has been erected at the N.E. corner of the aerodrome.

The name Donibristle has been marked in the middle of the surface of the aerodrome in large flat concrete letters; it runs due North and South, the "E" being the most Northern point.

Pilots should land on or near the name, as the surface at the sides of the aerodrome is rough and irregular.
