THE PROFITEERING ACTS, 1919 AND 1920, ORDER (No. 7), DATED 2ND JUNE, 1920, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE PROFITEERING ACT, 1919 (9 AND 10 GEO. 5, c. 66), AS AMENDED BY THE PRO-FITEERING (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1920 (10 AND 11 GEO. 5, c. 13).

Whereas Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919 (9 and 10 Geo. 5, C. 66), as amended by the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, C. 13), provides that that Section may be applied by Order of the Board of Trade to any article or class of articles declared by the Order to be one or one of a kind in common use by the public or being material, machinery or accessories used in the production thereof.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby declare that the articles of food set out in the Schedule annexed hereto are articles of a kind in common use by the public, and do hereby order that Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919 (9 and 10 Geo. 5, C. 66), as amended by the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, C. 13), shall apply to each article of food specifically mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into force as from the 4th day of June, 1920, and may be cited as the Profiteering Acts, 1919 and 1920, Order (No. 7).

## SCHEDULE.

The following articles of food (included in this Schedule by agreement with the Food Controller:

- 40. Cream.
- 41. Bread.
- 42. Brill, halibut, mackerel, salmon, soles, slips, trout, turbot and fresh herrings.
  - 43. Cocoa mixture and cocoa powder.
  - 44. Jam, jelly and marmalade.
  - 45. Flour.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade in Great Britain, as specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, namely:-

1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the before-mentioned fabrics; viz.:-

(a) Handkerchiefs (including. Mufflers

or Flags when made in association or conjunction with Handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-linen, Towels, Dusters, Tablenapery, Bed-spreads, Tea-cloths, Tablecentres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers, or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following oper-

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material:

(ii) Vice-folding;(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, over-locking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes if done by machine: -Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

processes  $\mathbf{of}$ laundering, (vi) All smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

The making up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing, and similar operations.

In accordance with the Regulations with respect to the constitution and proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board, dated 28th May, 1920, the Trade Board shall consist
