The Spaniards lost about 3 c: 400 Men. And the Count de Longueval, Licurenant General, was killed among others on the fide of the French. The 2000 Foot that went from Malaga the 13th of May, were arrived at Barcelona to reinforce the Spanish Army, and two Spanish Galleys that Convoyed them had taken a French Sattea richly laden. The Moors

The 22th another Party of the Enemies Troops was discovered in a Wood not far from our Camp, and 25 of them were killed, and 11 brought in very much wounded. In Flanders Prince Vaudemons continues with the Army under his Command near Ghent; and the Mareschal de Villeroy at Mach-leu near Deynse. The Landtgrave of Hesse was yesterday with the German Forces that are coming this way at Cornelis Munster, near Aix la Chapele. This Evening arrived here an Express from Piedsome, with Letters dated the 18th instant, in the Camp near Moncalier: They give an account, That the French had not yet attempted any thing, continuing in their Camp near Original, where they fuffer very much by the Scarcity of Provisions, and have lost a great many Men by Desertion. On the 17th a Parry State Allies are challengther of the French Out of the Allies attacked another of the French Ourguards, killed some, and carried the rest away. They had in the Duke of Sawy's Camp, when this Express came away, 200 French Prisoners, and above 400 Deferters, and the Peafants have killed a greater number; by which means the French had loft at least 1200 Men since they came into the Plains:
