of this house and garden to the Awarded Road known as Gibson's Lane, passing along the East side of this road to the North-west corner of Robert's Row, and from thence for a distance of 15 feet along the North side of Robert's Row where it strikes off in a southerly direction along the East side of No. 5, Robert's Row to the South-west angle of Messrs. Lowe, Son and Cobbold's Bottling Department and across North Street to the Boundary Cross on the South side, from thence through Browne's Hospital along the East Wall of No. 4 and the West Wall of No. 5 through the Boundary Cross in the Southern Boundary of Browne's Hospital to the centre of Broad Street, then along the centre of this street in a Southwesterly direction for a distance of 81 yards from which it branches off to the centre of the Eastern end of Crown Street, passing along the centre of Crown Street to Red Lion Square and along the East side of the Square about 6 yards from the building line to a point 8 yards West of the South-west corner of the London City and Midland Bank, and thence along the Southern side of the Square to the South-east corner of the Butter Market, passing down the centre of Horse Shoe Lane and across the Sheep Market to the centre of the Castle Dyke along the centre of Castle Dyke to the centre of the Lammas Bridge on the Westerly side, striking off in an Easterly direction along the centre of the Mill tail stream to its junction with the centre of the River Welland in a South-westerly direction to the point Southwest of the Bridge to the Nuns where the Ward Boundary commenced.

## "2. St. George's WARD.

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the Welland at the junction with St. Mary's Ward and opposite the Ford Wharf Road, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of the Welland to the G.N. Station, continuing in the same direction along the Borough Boundary to Hudds Mill to the junction of the River Gwash, continuing along the Boundary past Newstead, Grindlepits Spinney to the North-east corner of the Borough, thence along the Boundary to the West side of the Bourne Road at Borderville, passing in a Southerly direction along the West side of the Bourne Road to the Drift Road, along the North side of the Drift Road to the hedge joining the West Boundary of the land abutting on Doughty Street, thence North along this hedge to the North Boundary of the three fields abutting on the Drift Road, passing along this fence in a Westerly direction to the East side of Emlyn's Street at the North-west corner of Mr. Deer's property, from thence along the East side of Emlyn's Street to Alexandra Road, along the North side of this road to King's Road, passing South down the East side of King's Road to New Cross Road, along the North side of New Cross Road to the East side of Conduit Road, passing South along the East side of Conduit Road to East Street following along the centre of East Street in a Westerly direction to the Fire Station, around the centre of road in front of same and then in an Easterly direction along the centre of Elm Street to the East Boundary of the Rising Sun Public House and along such boundary to centre of Broad Street, Easterly along the centre of this street to the West side of Star Lane, along the West side of Star Lane for a

distance of 75 feet from the centre of Broad Street, and thence in a Westerly and Southerly direction along the East Boundary of premises used in connection with Mr. Sanders' Slaughter House and along the party wall between Nos. 3 and 4, St. Paul's Street, from thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of St. Paul's Street to the junction with the centre of St. George's Street, along the centre of St. George's Street to a point opposite the party wall between Nos. 21 and 22, St. George's Street, thence along such party wall to the rear of No. 22, along the party wall in a Southerly direction at the rear to the garden of same, passing thence in a Westerly direction to the West side of the garden wall and along the West side of the garden wall of Nos. 18, 19 and 20, St. George's Street to the junction with the North Boundary of the White Hart Public House, thence following the North and West Boundary of the White Hart Public House and No. 15, St. George's Street to the junction with the garden wall of Orme House, following along the North Boundary of Orme House to the centre of Maiden Lane, thence in a straight line to the centre of roadway in St. George's Square, going East along the centre of St. George's Square to a point opposite the centre of the passage between the Assembly Rooms and No. 21, St. George's Square, along the centre of this passage and across the gardens of No. 21 in a Southerly direction to the South side of Wharf Road, following around the West Boundary of the garden wall adjoining the Ford to the centre of the River Welland.

## "3. St. MARY'S WARD.

"Commencing in the centre of the River Welland at a point 34 yards West of the Town Bridge, from thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of the Mill Stream to the West side of the Lammas Bridge, passing along the West side of the Bridge in a Northerly direction across Bath Row and along the centre of Castle Dyke to Castle Street, across the Sheep Market to the centre of Horse Shoe Lane, along the centre of Horse Shoe Lane to the South-east corner of the Butter Market, from thence along the South side of Red Lion Square about 3 yards from the building line to a point 8 yards West of the South-west corner of the London City and Midland Bank, then along the East side of Red Lion Square about 6 yards from the building line to a point opposite the centre of Red Lion Street, along the centre of Red Lion Street to a point about 4 yards North of the North-east corner of Wellington Lane, from thence to the centre of Broad Street about 10 yards East of 52, Broad Street, passing along the centre of Broad Street to a point opposite the Boundary Cross in front of Browne's Hospital, from this point in a Northerly direction across Broad Street and through Browne's Hospital to the Boundary Cross in North Street, across North Street to the South-west corner of Messrs. Lowe, Son and Cobbold's Bottling Department, thence in a straight line to the North side of Robert's Row 5 yards East of the North-west corner along the North side of Robert's Row to the North-west corner, and from thence in a Northerly direction along the East side of the lane leading to Gibson's Cottages, at the end of which it passes along the South Boundary wall of Gibson's Cottages and from the South-
