The last Letters from those Parts give an account, That the Capain-General was gone to Sea with the Freet of this Republick, and that he would endeavour to meet with, and engage the Turkish Fleet, which was come to Scio, consisting of 36 Ships of War, including those of Birbary. The last Advices from Dalmatia Ly, all was very quiet on that side; and that the Turks had fent all the Forces they could spare to their Army in Hingary.

Vicana, June 20. The young Duke of Lorra ne arrived here this day from Insprucke, and after a flay of few days at this Court, will proceed for Hungary to make the Campaign in the Imperial Army. The last Advices from thence do all speak of the Siege of Temesiwaer, as a thing that was fully resolved on; The Army was, when these Letters were written, in the Neighbour-hood of Segedin; and some of them give us reason to believe, that the Place before this time is Invested, and the Trenches opened. We do not yet hear that the Enemy have any Forces together to disturb us in this Enterprize: The Sultan, according to our last accounts from Adrianople, was still there, and the time of his Departure for Hungary was not yet fixed, by reason several Baffa's, whom he expected with their Troops were Balla s, whom he expected with their 1 100ps were not arrived. Count Teckeley is with his Family at Conflantinople, but feems to have no great Credit at the Port. The Count de Starcmberg, Governor of this City, took the 15th instant a review of the 4000 Saxons, who came hither by Water from Lintz, and on the 17th they went again on Board their Vessels and proceeded for Hungary. A Regiment of Foot which the Flestor Palatin Regiment of Foot, which the Elector Palasin fends to the Emperor's Assistance, arrived here the 15th, and is likewife gone on to join the Imperial Army.

Berlin, June 26. The Letters from Poland tell us, That the Archbishop of Gnesna had, according to Custom, taken upon him the Administration of the Government during the Inter-regnum, and had ordered Summens to be fent out for the Gentle-men that have Voices at the Election, to meet in the usual manner.
