Table of Fees.

EXECUTION OF WRITS OF FIERI FACIAS.

1. *For Mileage* to include the mileage of the bailiff or the man in possession, *per mile* from the Sheriff's Officer's residence ... £0 1 0

When the place at which seizure is to be made is distant more than one mile and a half from the nearest railway station, there may be allowed, in lieu of mileage from the station to that place, out-of-pocket expenses actually and reasonably incurred for conveyance from the station to that place and back to the station.

2. *For Seizure* by the Sheriff's Officer for each building or place separately rated at which a seizure is made, when the sum indorsed on the Writ of Execution:—

does not exceed £100 ... £1 1 0
and when it exceeds £100 £1 11 6

3. *For Work Done* by the Sheriff's Officer in making enquiries as to claims for rent or to the goods, including copying claims and giving the necessary notices to all parties, a sum not exceeding £1 1 0

And for all out-of-pocket expenses actually and reasonably incurred in relation to such work, including postage, telegraphic and telephonic messages, a further sum not exceeding £1 1 0

NOTE.—The foregoing fees numbered 1, 2 and 3 shall be paid by the execution creditor, and shall not be recoverable by him although the execution proves abortive.

4. For man or, when necessary, men in possession, to provide his or their own board in every case per man per day ... £0 8 6

5. *For removal of goods or animals* to a place of safe keeping, when necessary, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

6. When goods or animals have been removed, for warehousing or taking charge of the same, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

7. For keep of animals while in the custody of the Sheriff, whether before or after removal, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

NOTE.—No fees for keeping possession of goods or animals to be charged after the goods or animals have been removed.

8. *For Sale or preparation for Sale by Auction.*

(1) *When Sale by Auction takes place.*

(a) For commission to the Auctioneer, to include inventory and valuation, compiling catalogue and preparing for sale, 7½ per cent. on the sum realised not exceeding £100, 5 per cent. on the next £900, and 4 per cent. on any sum beyond £1,000.

(b) For advertising and giving publicity to the sale, printing catalogues and bills and distributing and posting the same, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

(c) For labour employed in lotting, showing the goods, attending the sale and superintending the removal of the goods by purchasers, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

(2) *When no Sale takes place either by Auction or by private contract.*

(a) For work actually done in preparing inventory and valuation, compiling catalogue and preparing for sale a sum not exceeding 4 per cent. on the value of the goods if such value does not exceed £200. If the value is in excess of that amount a sum not exceeding 4 per cent. on the first £200, and a further sum not exceeding 3 per cent. on the excess.

(b) For advertising and giving publicity to the intended sale, printing catalogues and bills, and distributing and posting the same, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

(c) For labour (if any) employed in lotting and showing the goods, the sum actually and reasonably paid.

9. *For Sale by Private Contract.*

(a) Half the percentage allowed on a sale by auction; and in addition:—

(b) For work actually done in preparing inventory and valuation, and for all work (if any) actually done in preparing for sale by auction a sum not exceeding in any event 2½ per cent. on the value of the goods.

(c) And for advertising and giving publicity to any intended sale by auction, printing catalogues and bills and distributing and posting the same and for labour employed in lotting and showing the goods, the sums (if any) actually and reasonably paid.

10. *Sheriff's poundage and the fee for delivery of the Writ to the Under-Sheriff shall be the same as before until further Order.*

The foregoing fees numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 (1), 9 and 10 shall be levied in every case in which an execution is completed by sale, as fees payable to Sheriffs were levied before the making of this Order.

In every case where an execution is withdrawn, satisfied, or stopped, the fees under this Order shall be paid by the person issuing the execution, or the person at whose instance the sale is stopped, as the case may be.

The amount of any fees and charges payable under this Table shall be taxed by a Master of the Supreme Court or a District Registrar of the High Court, as the case may be, in case the Sheriff and the party liable to pay such fees and charges differ as to the amount thereof.

The Order as to Fees made under the Sheriffs Act, 1887, and dated the 31st August, 1888, is hereby annulled from the 18th day of July, 1920, except as to proceedings under Writs of Execution issued before that date, to which proceedings the said Order shall continue to apply.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A SPECIAL
ORDER, TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS
(BOOT AND FLOOR POLISH) ORDER, 1920.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he intends, pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the appendix to this notice.

Copies of the Draft Special Order may be obtained on application, in writing, to the Secretary, Ministry of Labour, Montagu House, Whitehall, S.W. 1.

Objections to the Draft Special Order must be sent to the above address within forty-two days from the 9th July, 1920.

Every objection must be in writing, and must state:—

- (a) The specific grounds for objection; and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

TRADE.

The Boot and Floor Polish Trade, that is to say:—

(1) the manufacture of boot or shoe polish or cream, blacking, dubbin, or floor polish or cream; and

(2) the manufacture of stain for leather, or of polish for leather or furniture, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) above,

including the following or similar operations when incidental to operations included in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

(i.) Checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;

(ii.) Filling, lidding, boxing, bottling, packeting, labelling;

(iii.) Packing, unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping; but excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

LAUNDRY TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR CERTAIN
CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 19th July, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by

the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Laundry Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, having given due notice on the 23rd March, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, hereby give notice that they have fixed General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers and declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, the minimum rates as fixed and the normal number of hours as declared being as shown in the Schedule set out below which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 5th July, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates as fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 19th July, 1920,* as the date from which such rates shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 25th July, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

SECTION I.—*General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Wash-house and General Inside Workers.*

(a)

1. Workers of under 15 years of age, 15s. per week.
2. Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 18s. per week.
3. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week.
4. Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week.
5. Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 36s. per week.
6. Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 44s. per week.
7. Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 52s. per week.
8. Workers of 21 years of age and over, 60s. per week.

(b) Provided that in the case of any worker who enters the trade for the first time at or over the age of 17 years and under 21 years of age and who is employed on Time-work, the Minimum Rates payable shall be during the first six months of employment in the trade:—

1. For Workers entering the trade at 17 and under 18 years of age, 22s. per week.
2. For Workers entering the trade at 18 and under 19 years of age, 28s. per week.
3. For Workers entering the trade at 19 and under 20 years of age, 36s. per week.
4. For workers entering the trade at 20 and under 21 years of age, 44s. per week.

On the completion of six months' employment in the Trade the minimum rate payable shall be that applicable to a worker according to his age as set out in Section I (a) above.

(c) Provided also that in the case of any worker who enters the trade for the first time at or over the age of 21 years and who is employed on Time-work, the Minimum Rates payable during the first twelve months of employment shall be:—

1. During the first six months of employment, 52s. per week.
2. During the second six months of employment, 56s. per week.

On the completion of twelve months' employment in the Trade, the Minimum Rate payable shall be the full Minimum Rate of 60s. per week.

SECTION II.—The above General Minimum Time-Rates are for a week not exceeding 48 hours and save as provided in Section V hereof no deductions shall be made from such rates where the number of hours of work in any week is less than 48 except:—

(a) Where the worker is absent without the permission of the employer or at his own request or in order to comply with an obligation imposed by Law, or through being incapacitated from work by illness or other cause, or during any customary local holidays.

(b) Where, at his own desire, it is agreed that any worker shall be regularly employed for a less period than the full working week of the Laundry.

(c) Where, in pursuance of an agreement made in writing between an employer and the workers affected (and registered with the Trade Board) it is provided that by reason of seasonal trade, or for any cause not within the control of the employer, short time is regularly to be worked for any period commencing not less than seven days after the date of such agreement.

(d) Where in any week a worker is required to stand off for not less than a quarter of the normal working week of the Laundry by reason of a stoppage of work caused by a breakdown in machinery, a stoppage in supplies of water, gas, electric current or fuel, a general breakdown in transport services or other similar emergency over which the employer has no control. Provided that this clause shall not operate until the expiration of at least seven days from the date on which notice so to stand off is given to the worker by the employer.

In such cases a proportionate deduction may be made according as the number of hours worked is less than the full working week of the Laundry when not on short time.

Provided that for the purpose of calculating the proportionate deduction under the provisions of the foregoing clause, no deduction shall be made in respect of absence from work on any day during which the Laundry is closed by reason of such day being a holiday allowed to female workers under the provisions of Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, except where in any week in which such holiday occurs the worker without reasonable and sufficient cause absents himself for more than two hours during the period in which he had the opportunity of working.

SECTION III.

Overtime Rates for Time-Workers.

Employed as Wash-House and General Inside Workers.

(a)

1. For workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 15s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 4½d. per hour.

2. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 18s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 5½d. per hour.

3. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 22s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 7d. per hour.

4. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 28s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 8½d. per hour.

5. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 36s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 11½d. per hour.

6. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 44s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 1s. 1½d. per hour.

7. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 52s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 1s. 4½d. per hour.

8. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 56s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 1s. 5½d. per hour.

9. For Workers entitled under Section I. above to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 60s. per week, the Overtime Rate shall be 1s. 6½d. per hour.

(b) The normal number of hours per week is hereby declared to be 48 and the above Overtime Rates shall be payable in respect of all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours.

(c) The normal number of hours of work on Saturday (or on such weekly short day other than Saturday as has been substituted for Saturday in pursuance of the provisions of Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, as respects female workers) is hereby declared to be five and the above Overtime Rates shall be payable in respect of time worked on such day in excess of five hours, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION IV.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, to all Male Workers in Great Britain as specified in Section I. of this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the laundering of articles of every description and all processes and operations incidental thereto performed by way of trade or for the purpose of gain), as varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, by virtue of which all processes of laundering and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles specified in the Appendices to the three last mentioned Orders are excluded from

the scope of the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919.

Provided that the Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall not apply to male workers wholly or mainly employed as transport workers, enginemen or stokers.

SECTION V.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions as are provided for in Section II., deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION VI.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages.

(GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 7TH JULY, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Button-making Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Button-making Order), 1919, having given due notice on 26th March, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers other than Home-workers, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade for the purposes of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 1st July, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 7th July, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

*Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 13th July, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

*General Minimum Time-Rates.*A.—*Male Workers.*

SECTION I.—For Male Workers employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning, Dipping,

Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes):—

1. Workers of 21 years of age and over:—

(a) Who have had not less than two years' experience in one or more of the aforesaid operations, 1s. 6d. per hour.

(b) Who have had not less than one but less than two years' experience in one or more of the aforesaid operations, 1s. 5d. per hour.

(c) Who have had less than one year's experience in one or more of the aforesaid operations, 1s. 4d. per hour.

2. Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. 3d. per hour.

3. Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 1s. per hour.

4. Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 10d. per hour.

SECTION II.—For all other Male Workers of 18 years of age and over:—

1. Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 3½d. per hour.

2. Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. 2d. per hour.

3. Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 1s. 1d. per hour.

4. Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 1s. per hour.

SECTION III.—For all Male Workers under 18 years of age:—

1. Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

2. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

3. Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5d. per hour.

4. Workers under 15 years of age, 4d. per hour.

B.—Female Workers.

1. Workers of 18 years of age and over, 8½d. per hour.

2. Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

3. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

4. Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5d. per hour.

5. Workers under 15 years of age, 4d. per hour.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—For Male Workers employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning, Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), 1s. 10½d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning, Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 10½d. per hour to an ordinary Male Worker (*i.e.*, a Male Worker of ordinary skill and experience in these processes).

SECTION II.—For all Female Workers, 10d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 10d. per hour to an ordinary Female Worker (*i.e.*, a Female Worker of ordinary skill and experience in the circumstances in question).

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 47.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime for Male Workers employed on Time-work, and for all Female Workers, in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the Trade, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) Male and Female Workers employed on Time-Work:—

(1) For all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the general minimum time-rate applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

Provided that the said Overtime Rate shall not apply—

(i) In respect of time worked on Good Friday in the case of workers who are given Easter Tuesday as a holiday in lieu of Good Friday; or

(ii) In respect of time worked on Easter Tuesday in the case of workers who are given Good Friday as a holiday in lieu of Easter Tuesday.

(2) For all hours worked in excess of five on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

(3) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

(b) Female Workers employed on Piece-Work:—

Female Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour worked in excess of 47 hours in any week, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, at least 10d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, the sum of 1d. per hour.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers specified in Parts I and II above in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture of buttons, button moulds, upholsterers' buttons, or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the processes of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing,

sewing, crocheting, or the covering of button moulds;
including—

(a) The manufacture of studs, links, or parts thereof, from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;

(b) The manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;

(d) All despatching, packing, warehousing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

but excluding—

(e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;

(f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

Provided that the above Minimum Rates shall not apply to Home-Workers.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

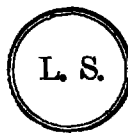

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

*Regulations applicable to the Animal on

3. The animal on being landed shall forthwith be moved, under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and confined in a suitable crate or

box from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days, and during such period no other animal shall be moved into such premises.

(ENGLAND AND WALES).SPECIAL RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR THE
CORN HARVEST IN YORKSHIRE.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give Notice, as required by the above Act, that they have varied during the period of the corn harvest the minimum and overtime rates, and the definition of overtime employment in force under their Orders as regards male and female workers in the area comprising the administrative counties of the East Riding, the North Riding and the West Riding of Yorkshire, and the county boroughs of Kingston-upon-Hull, Middlesbrough, Barnsley, Bradford, Dewsbury, Halifax, Huddersfield, Leeds, Rotherham, Sheffield, Wakefield and York, so as to provide as follows, that is to say:—

1. During the periods hereinafter mentioned:

(a) The wages payable for employment of any male worker in agriculture of the age of 18 years and over shall be not less than wages at the weekly rate of £4 in respect of all hours of work (including meal times) on a week-day after the hour

of 6.45 a.m. and up to the hour of 7.0 p.m., when cutting or stooking work only is in progress, and up to the hour of 8.0 p.m. when carting work is in progress.

(b) The minimum rate at which wages are to be paid for employment of any male worker in agriculture under the age of 18 years or of any female worker in agriculture for the number of hours specified in paragraph 1 (a) above shall be not less than 50 per cent. in excess of the minimum rate which but for this provision would be applicable to him or her under any other Order of the Board for the time being in force.

2. In the case of a worker employed for the whole of the harvest on a farm comprising more than 10 acres of corn, the above rates shall apply for a period of four weeks from the day on which such worker is first employed on that farm in general harvest work, notwithstanding that such worker may not be employed for the whole of this period in harvest work, and after the expiration of such period of four weeks the above rates shall apply in respect of each day upon which such worker is employed in harvest work.

3. In the case of a worker employed on a farm not comprising 10 acres of corn or

employed for less than the whole period of harvest, the above rates shall apply only in respect of each day in which the worker is employed on harvest work, any other work during the harvest period being subject to the ordinary minimum rates which but for this Order would be applicable.

4. The differential rates of wages for overtime employment, whether on week-days or on Sundays, payable to male and female workers employed on the Corn Harvest during such overtime as they are so employed, shall be as follows, in lieu of the overtime rates otherwise applicable to such workers under any Order of the Wages Board for the time being in force:—

(a) In the case of male workers of 18 years of age and over, double the rate which but for this provision would be applicable to him at the commencement of the harvest.

(b) In the case of male workers under 18 years of age and of female workers, 50 per cent. in excess of the rate which but for this provision would be applicable to him or her at the commencement of the harvest.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the

following employment only shall be treated as overtime employment:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment on any other day before the hour of 6.45 a.m. and all employment after the hour of 8 p.m. (or where cutting or stooking work only is in progress, after the hour of 7 p.m.).

6. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

7. During the period of 4 weeks above mentioned the value at which the provision by an employer to a male worker of 18 years of age or over for full board and lodging for a 7-day week may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash shall be 22s.

INTERIM REVISION OF RATES, FARES, TOLLS,
DUES AND CHARGES.

Notice is hereby given that the Rates Advisory Committee, appointed under Section 21 of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, will hold a public enquiry at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, 13th July, 1920, in the Old Hall, Lincoln's Inn, London, W.C. 2, to consider the following Reference:—

" I am directed by the Minister of Transport to inform you that since the issue of his directions on the 20th and 23rd December, 1919, to the Railway Companies of the United Kingdom to increase their charges, it is estimated that the financial result of working British Railways (including Ireland) will show a deficiency as from 1st April, 1920, at the rate of £54,500,000 per annum which includes increases of £4,400,000 in salaries and wages which came into force on the 1st July under the provisions of the Sliding Scale.

The declared policy of the Government is that the Railways are to be maintained upon a self-supporting basis and are not to be subsidised by the taxpayer. As four months of the present financial year will probably have elapsed before any recommendations of the Committee can be given effect to, it would, in the opinion of the Government, be unduly severe on the trading and travelling public to impose such increases of rates, fares and charges as would in the remaining eight months restore equilibrium by the end of the Financial Year, but they desire that equilibrium shall be reached not later than the end of June, 1921, thereby equating in 11 months the receipts and expenditure of 15 months.

The intention of the Government is that in June, 1921, the rates, fares and charges then in force shall be reviewed with a view to their reduction if circumstances permit.

The Minister accordingly desires the Committee to consider and advise him, what increases should be made in the rates, fares, tolls, dues and charges of such Companies so as to

yield by the end of June, 1921, the total deficit which commenced to accrue on the 1st April last.

The Committee are asked to treat the Irish Railway Companies as a separate unit and the deficiency in respect of those Railways may be assumed at the rate of £2,200,000 per annum.

The Government attach great importance to the fair maintenance of coastwise traffic, and the Committee are asked specially to advise, if having regard to the information obtained in the course of the inquiry they are at present engaged upon they are able to do so, what increases should be made in the exceptional rates charged by the Railway Companies in consequence of water competition.

The Committee are also aware that the Minister has not issued any Direction to the Railway Companies modifying their charges in respect of services or accommodation provided at their Docks, and the Committee are asked to consider to what extent these should be increased. Also what increases should be made in the charges for season tickets, and in workmen's fares, and other fares lower than ordinary fares, which are the subject of the Minister's Remit to the Committee of the 5th May, 1920.

As regards Ireland the Minister will be glad if the Committee will consider in particular what increases should be directed to be charged by the Great Southern and Western Railway Company, whose rates were not subject to the percentage increase added to other Irish Railway rates in 1913 and 1916."
