*Extension of Scheduled District No. 2.*

1. The Scheduled District (No. 2), referred to in the Norfolk (Emneth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 7) is hereby extended so as to comprise the District described in the Schedule hereto, which shall thereupon be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

2. This Order shall be cited as the Norfolk (Emneth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 8), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article I.

SCHEDULE.

*Extended Scheduled District No. 2.*

2. A District in the administrative county of Norfolk, comprising the parishes of Middleton, Setchey, East Winch, West Bilney, Pentney, East Walton, West Acre, Castle Acre, Newton by Castle Acre, Little Dunham, Sporle with Palgrave, Swaffham, South Acre, Narford, Narborough, Beechamwell, Barton Bendish, Fincham, Stradsett, Shouldham Thorpe, Tottenhill, Wormegay, Shouldham, Marham, Gayton Thorpe, Gayton, Grimston, Bawsey, Mintlyn, North Runcton, West Winch, Ashwicken, Leziat, Crimplasham, West Dereham, Werekham, Wretton, Stoke Ferry, Northwold, Boughton, Oxborough, Caldecote, Shingham, Cockley Cley, North Pickenham, Houghton on the Hill, South Pickenham, Great Cressingham, Hilborough, Gooderstone and Foulden.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST JULY 1920.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned

in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Cumberland, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

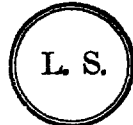
(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situated.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

STAMP DUTIES.

Whereas section 12 (2) of the Finance Act, 1899, provides, inter alia, that His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may substitute, as respects any foreign or colonial currency mentioned in the schedule to that Act, any rate of exchange for that specified in the schedule, and that such Act shall be construed
