SECTION II.

In cases where the worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker (i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question) an amount not less than the piece-work basis time rate applicable.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than the 22nd of August, 1920.
