AIR MINISTRY NOTICES TO AIRMEN.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT.

1. Information relating to aerial navigation, wireless telegraphy, aerodromes and landing grounds, Customs stations, prohibited areas and other questions of urgent and general interest, is issued, in the form of printed "Notices to Airmen" in a consecutively numbered series, by the Air Ministry when considered necessary for the benefit of Pilots and others directly interested in aviation.

2. "Notices" containing information of an urgent nature are given out in the first instance by wireless telegraphy.

3. It is important that all Pilots actually engaged in flying should make themselves acquainted with these "Notices to Airmen" as

soon as they appear. Arrangements have accordingly been made for their display at terminal and customs aerodromes at home and abroad, and for their distribution to, among others :—

The technical and daily Press.

The Aeronautical Associations and Clubs.

Licenseses of permanent aerodromes.

Lloyds.

H.B.M. Representatives abroad.

4. Copies of the "Notices" can be obtained direct from the Secretary, Air Ministry. Pilots employed by aviation firms should arrange to secure "Notices" regularly through their employers, and unattached Pilots can obtain copies through their Association or Club.

5. The latest "Notices" can also be seen at all Civil Aerodromes, and copies can be obtained personally from the C.A.T.O.'s at Croydon and Lympne.

6. When abroad the latest "Notices" can be seen at the Customs Aerodrome in the country visited.
