The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Suspend-
 sory Act, 1914, that notwithstanding
 anything in the Government of Ireland
 Act, 1914, no steps shall be taken to put that
 Act into operation until the expiration of
 twelve months from the date of the passing of
 that Act, or, if at the expiration of those
 twelve months the present War has not ended,
 until such later date (not being later than the
 end of the present War) as may be fixed by
 His Majesty by Order in Council; and that the
 provisions of that Act shall have effect
 accordingly:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the
 14th day of September, 1915, His Majesty was
 pleased to order that no steps should be taken
 to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914,
 into operation until the expiration of eighteen
 months from the date of the passing of that
 Act, unless the present War had previously
 ended, nor, if at the expiration of those
 eighteen months the present War had not
 ended, until such later date, not being later

than the end of the present War, as might
 thereafter be fixed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by
 Order in Council dated the 29th day of Feb-
 ruary, 1916, to extend by six months the time
 mentioned in the said Order of the 14th day of
 September, 1915, and by Order in Council
 dated the 7th day of September, 1916, to ex-
 tend that time by a further period of six
 months, and by Order in Council dated the
 13th day of March, 1917, to extend that time
 by a further period of six months, and by
 Order in Council dated the 22nd day of August,
 1917, to extend that time by a further period
 of six months, and by Order in Council dated
 the 27th day of February, 1918, to extend that
 time by a further period of six months, and by
 Order in Council of the 4th day of September,
 1918, to extend that time by a further period
 of six months, and by Order in Council of the
 12th day of March, 1919, to extend that time
 by a further period of six months, and by
 Order in Council of the 18th day of August,
 1919, to extend that time by a further period
 of six months, and by Order in Council of the
 2nd day of March, 1920, to extend that time
 by a further period of six months:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further
 the time mentioned in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by

and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that:—

No steps shall be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of a period of six months after the termination of the eighteen months and nine periods of six months mentioned in the recited Orders, unless the present War has previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of that period the present War has not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council.

DISTRESS FOR RENT.

Notice is hereby given of the following Rules, and Treasury Order regulating Fees, under the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1888, and the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1895:—

THE DISTRESS FOR RENT RULES, 1920, DATED AUGUST 11, 1920, MADE BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR UNDER THE LAW OF DISTRESS AMENDMENT ACT, 1888, AND THE LAW OF DISTRESS AMENDMENT ACT, 1895.

Preliminary.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Distress for Rent Rules, 1920, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1920.

2. In these Rules—

“Judge” means a judge of County Courts.

“Certificate” means a certificate to act as a bailiff granted or renewed under the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1888, as amended by the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1895.

“Registrar” means the registrar of a County Court, and each registrar when there are more than one, and includes a deputy registrar.

Certificates.

3. Certificates may be either general or special. A special certificate shall specify the particular distress or distresses to which it applies. Certificates shall be in the Forms Nos. 1 and 2 in Appendix I. to these Rules, with such variations as circumstances may require; and the date at which a general certificate will become terminable shall be added at the foot thereof.

4. A special certificate may be granted by a judge or registrar, but a general certificate shall only be granted by a judge in person.

5. A general certificate shall authorise the bailiff named in it to levy at any place in England or Wales.

6. No certificate shall be granted to any officer of a County Court except by way of renewal of a certificate granted to an officer appointed before the 31st day of August, 1888.

7. Any practising solicitor of the Supreme Court shall, on application, and on payment of the prescribed fee, be entitled to a general or special certificate.

8. Subject to the two last preceding rules, a general or special certificate may, on payment of the prescribed fee, be granted to any applicant who satisfies the authority granting

the same that he is a fit and proper person to hold a certificate.

9. An applicant for a general certificate shall satisfy the Judge that he is resident or has his principal place of business in the district of the Court, and shall state whether he has ever been refused a certificate, or had a former certificate cancelled or declared void.

Security.

10. Where an applicant for a certificate is not a ratepayer, rated on a rateable value of not less than £25 per annum; he may, if the authority applied to thinks fit, be required to give security for the due performance of his duties.

11. The security shall be security to the satisfaction of the registrar. In the case of a general certificate the amount shall be £20, and in the case of a special certificate the amount shall be £5.

12. The security shall be given to the registrar. It may be given by deposit, or by bond, or by guarantee, as the registrar may think fit.

Duration and Renewal of Certificates.

13. A general certificate shall (unless previously cancelled or declared void) have effect until the 1st of February next after the expiration of twelve months from the granting thereof, provided that the Judge of the Court where the certificate was granted may renew the same from time to time for the like period.

14. On an application for the renewal of a certificate the registrar shall be satisfied that the security (if any) required under these Rules or the Rules hereby annulled is subsisting.

15. A renewed certificate shall be in the Form No. 3 in Appendix I. to these Rules, and the date at which the renewed certificate will become terminable shall be added at the foot thereof.

Cancellation of Certificates.

16. On any application to cancel or declare void a certificate the Judge may, whether he cancels the certificate or not, order that the security shall be forfeited either wholly or in part, and that the amount directed to be forfeited shall be paid to the party aggrieved.

17. Where the Judge orders that the security shall be forfeited, either wholly or in part, but does not cancel or declare void the certificate, he may direct that the bailiff shall give fresh security as a condition of retaining his certificate.

18. Subject to Rule 16, where a certificate is cancelled or declared void by the Judge, the security shall also be cancelled, and the deposit (if any) returned.

19. Where a certificate is cancelled or declared void the Form No. 4 in Appendix I. to these Rules shall be used.

20. Where a certificate is cancelled or declared void or expires in consequence of non-renewal, it shall nevertheless continue to have effect for the purpose of any distress where the bailiff has entered into possession before the date on which the certificate is cancelled or declared void or expires.

List of Certificates.

21. There shall be made and signed by the registrar of every court on the 1st of February in every year, and exhibited in the office

of the court a list of the bailiffs holding certificates for the time being, and if any such certificate is cancelled or declared void the fact of it having been cancelled or declared void shall be notified by the registrar on such list and published by him in some local newspaper.

Fees, Charges and Expenses.

22. No person shall be entitled to any fees, charges or expenses for levying a distress, or for doing any act or thing in relation thereto, other than those specified in and authorised by the table in Appendix II. to these Rules.

23. Where the rent demanded and due exceeds £20 the fees, charges and expenses specified in Scale I. shall be allowed, and where the rent demanded and due does not exceed £20 the fees, charges and expenses specified in Scale II. shall be allowed.

24. In case of any difference as to fees, charges and expenses between the parties, or any of them, the fees, charges and expenses shall be taxed by the registrar of the County Court in the district of which the distress is levied. The registrar may make such order as he thinks fit as to the costs of such taxation.

25. A copy of the table of fees, charges and expenses authorised by these Rules shall be posted up by the registrar of every court in a conspicuous place in his office.

26. Every bailiff levying a distress shall on the request of the tenant produce to him his certificate and a copy of the table of fees, charges and expenses authorised by these Rules.

Repeal.

27. On the coming into operation of these Rules the Distress for Rent Rules, 1888, and the Rules made under the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1895, shall be annulled, except as to distresses levied before that date, to which the said Rules shall continue to apply: and these Rules shall apply to distresses levied after that date, and shall apply to certificates granted or renewed before that date as if these Rules had been in force when such certificates were granted or renewed.

APPENDIX II.

TABLES OF FEES, CHARGES AND EXPENSES.

SCALE I.

Distresses for Rent where the Sum Demanded and Due Exceeds £20.

1. For levying distress. Three per cent. on any sum exceeding £20 and not exceeding £50. Two and a half per cent. on any additional sum up to £200, and one per cent. for any additional sum.

2. For man in possession 7s. per day, to provide his own board in every case.

3. For appraisalment, where the tenant or owner of the goods and chattels by writing requires such appraisalment to be made, 6d. in the £ on the value as appraised, whether by one broker or more, in addition to the amount for the stamp, with a minimum fee of 5s. for each broker, the costs of the appraisalment to be borne by the tenant or owner requiring the same.

4. For removal, at the request in writing of the tenant or owner of the goods and chattels distrained, the reasonable costs and charges attending such removal, to be borne and paid by such tenant or owner, and to be subject to taxation under Rule 24.

5. For advertisements, the sum actually and necessarily paid.

6. For commission to the auctioneer on sale by auction, ten per cent. on the sum realised not exceeding £100, five per cent. on the next £200, four per cent. on the next £200, and on any additional sum three per cent. up to £1,000, and two and a half per cent. on any sum exceeding £1,000.

7. Reasonable fees, charges and expenses where distress is withdrawn, or where no sale takes place, and for negotiations between landlord and tenant respecting the distress, subject to taxation under Rule 24.

8. A fraction of £1 to be in all cases for the purpose of calculating poundage reckoned as £1.

SCALE II.

Distresses for Rent where the Sum Demanded and Due does not Exceed £20.

1. For levying distress, where the sum demanded and due does not exceed £10, 5s.; exceeds £10, 7s. 6d.

2. For man in possession, 6s. per day; to provide his own board in every case.

3. For appraisal, where the tenant or owner of the goods and chattels by writing requires such appraisal to be made, 6d. in the £ on the value as appraised, whether by one broker or more, in addition to the amount for the stamp, with a minimum fee of 5s. for each broker; the costs of appraisal to be borne and paid by the tenant or owner requiring the same.

4. For removal, at the request in writing of the tenant or owner of the goods and chattels distrained, the reasonable costs and charges attending such removal, to be borne and paid by such tenant or owner, and to be subject to taxation under Rule 24.

5. For all expenses for advertisements, if any, 10s.

6. For catalogues, sale and commission and delivery of goods, seven and a half per cent. on the sum realised.

7. Reasonable fees, charges and expenses, where distress is withdrawn, or where no sale takes place, and for negotiations between landlord and tenant respecting the distress, not to exceed in any event five per cent. on the sum demanded and due for rent, and to be subject to taxation under Rule 24.

8. A fraction of £1 to be in all cases for the purpose of calculating poundage reckoned as £1.

TREASURY ORDER, DATED AUGUST 23, 1920, REGULATING FEES UNDER THE LAW OF DISTRESS AMENDMENT ACT, 1888, AND THE LAW OF DISTRESS AMENDMENT ACT, 1895, AND THE RULES MADE THEREUNDER.

In pursuance of the powers given by the County Courts Acts, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, we the undersigned, two of the Commissioners of the Treasury, whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby, with the consent of the Lord Chancellor, order that on and after the first day of October, 1920, the several fees or sums in the name of fees, specified in the Schedule hereunder written, shall be taken on the proceedings under the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1888, and the Law of Distress Amendment Act, 1895, and the Rules made thereunder mentioned in the said Schedule, in lieu of all other fees for such proceedings; and that the fees so authorised to be taken shall be received by the registrars of the different County Courts for the use of themselves.

PROHIBITED AREAS IN SWEDEN.

A Royal Decree, regarding air traffic over Swedish territory, was signed on 23rd May, 1919.

Paragraph 8 of the above Decree defines the prohibited areas as follows:—

“Without a personal licence granted by the Crown, after due application, aircraft shall not travel over the forbidden areas of the fortresses of Boden Hemsjö, Vaxholm, Karlsborg, or Karlskrona, over the forbidden area of the fortress of Ålsoberg east of the longitude and north of the latitude passing through Branno Kummel, or over the land area east and north of the Luleå-Riksgränsen Railway; nevertheless the forbidden area of the fortress of Vaxholm may be travelled over on a line passing through Badstuguholmen in Stora Vartan, Oranienholmen in Trälhavet, Björnholmen in the Edofjärden, and finally Troskskar in the Svartlogafjärden, and the forbidden area of the fortress of Karlskrona along a line passing through Torhamnsudde, Sälljo södra udde (south point), Torko norra udde (north point), and finally Gjökalö, as well as along the railway line Eringsboda-Nattraby.”

Provisions as to Licences.

2.—(1) A licence under this Order shall not be granted unless and until satisfactory evidence is produced that the article in respect of which the licence is desired has been brought by sea from a country other than Belgium and that it has been brought to Belgium only for the purpose of transhipment to Great Britain.

(2) A licence under this Order shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order, and shall contain the several particulars therein specified.

(3) The licence shall accompany the article to Great Britain, and shall be delivered up at

the port of landing in Great Britain to an officer of Customs and Excise demanding the same.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall take immediate effect.

Offences.

4.—(1) If any article to which this Order applies shall be landed in Great Britain in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, shall each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient after inquiry that an animal in the Scheduled District

should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the Principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

GLAMORGAN (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain District.

1.—(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Ministry authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the

dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Ministry under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Ministry may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Ministry think necessary or expedient.

(2.) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the dog from the Ministry and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Ministry or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

4.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained,

slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Ministry, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is re-

quired to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground; common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall take immediate effect.

11. This Order may be cited as the GLAMORGAN (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The East Sussex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall apply only to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and that Area, subject to the modification contained in Article 2 of the first-mentioned Order, shall be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

Revocation.

2. The East Sussex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1920 (Nos. 2, 3 and 4) are revoked from and after the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the EAST SUSSEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH

DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.
