PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Suspend-
 sory Act, 1914, that notwithstanding
 anything in the Government of Ireland
 Act, 1914, no steps shall be taken to put that
 Act into operation until the expiration of
 twelve months from the date of the passing of
 that Act, or, if at the expiration of those
 twelve months the present War has not ended,
 until such later date (not being later than the
 end of the present War) as may be fixed by
 His Majesty by Order in Council; and that the
 provisions of that Act shall have effect
 accordingly:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the
 14th day of September, 1915, His Majesty was
 pleased to order that no steps should be taken
 to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914,
 into operation until the expiration of eighteen
 months from the date of the passing of that
 Act, unless the present War had previously
 ended, nor, if at the expiration of those
 eighteen months the present War had not
 ended, until such later date, not being later

than the end of the present War, as might
 thereafter be fixed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by
 Order in Council dated the 29th day of Feb-
 ruary, 1916, to extend by six months the time
 mentioned in the said Order of the 14th day of
 September, 1915, and by Order in Council
 dated the 7th day of September, 1916, to ex-
 tend that time by a further period of six
 months, and by Order in Council dated the
 13th day of March, 1917, to extend that time
 by a further period of six months, and by
 Order in Council dated the 22nd day of August,
 1917, to extend that time by a further period
 of six months, and by Order in Council dated
 the 27th day of February, 1918, to extend that
 time by a further period of six months, and by
 Order in Council of the 4th day of September,
 1918, to extend that time by a further period
 of six months, and by Order in Council of the
 12th day of March, 1919, to extend that time
 by a further period of six months, and by
 Order in Council of the 18th day of August,
 1919, to extend that time by a further period
 of six months, and by Order in Council of the
 2nd day of March, 1920, to extend that time
 by a further period of six months:

 the time mentioned in the said Orders:
