TREASURY REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, RELATING TO PENSIONERS TO WHOM SECTION 1 OF THE ACT APPLIES.

1. The pensioners to whom these rules apply are pensioners who on the sixteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty, were in receipt of pensions granted—

under the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1914;

under the Elementary School Teachers' (Superannuation) Acts, 1898 to 1912, or under the code of regulations for public elementary schools or under the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908;

under the National School Teachers' (Ireland) Act, 1879;

under the enactments relating to the pay and pensions of the Royal Irish Constabulary and the Dublin Metropolitan Police;

and in whose case the following statutory conditions are fulfilled:—

The pensioner must reside in the British Islands;

The pensioner must have attained the age of sixty years or have retired on account of physical or mental infirmity, or, in the case of a pensioner who is a widow and is in receipt of a pension payable in respect of the services of her deceased husband, must have attained the age of forty years;

The pensioner must satisfy the Pension Authority that his means, including his pen-

sion, are less than one hundred and fifty pounds a year, if unmarried, or two hundred pounds a year, if married.

For the purposes of the statutory conditions, a widower or widow with one or more children under sixteen years of age dependent on him or her will be treated as married, and a widower or widow having no such children will be treated as unmarried.

2. An application for an increase of pension under the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), shall be made to the Government Department through whom the original pension is payable (hereinafter referred to as the Pension Authority).

3. An application in the case of a pensioner who fulfils the statutory conditions at the date of the making of these rules should be made as soon as practicable. In the case of a pensioner who hereafter fulfils the statutory conditions, the application should be made not more than three months before or as soon as may be after the statutory conditions are fulfilled.

4. Every application must be accompanied by a declaration in the form set out in the Schedule hereto made before one of the following persons, that is to say, a justice of the peace, a commissioner for oaths, a commissioned officer not below the rank of lieutenant-commander in the Navy or major in the Army, a barrister-at-law, a minister of religion, a bank

manager, or in Scotland a bank agent, a medical practitioner, a collector of customs and excise, an inspector of taxes.

5. The statement as to amounts in the declaration shall be made with reference to twelve months preceding the date of the declaration, provided that if the applicant shows to the satisfaction of the Pension Authority that there has been such a change of circumstances that his means in the ensuing year will be materially reduced, the Pension Authority may take such change into consideration.

6. Where in pursuance of an application an increase of pension is granted, the increase shall continue in force for twelve months unless in the meantime the pensioner dies or ceases to fulfil the statutory conditions:

Provided that in cases where the application is made before the first day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty, the period for which the increase granted in pursuance of such application will run will be the period of twelve months from the date as from which the increase is payable instead of a period of twelve months from the date of the grant.

7. Applications for the continuance and reassessment of increases of pensions, accompanied by a like declaration, shall be sent to the Pension Authority not more than three nor less than two months before the expiration of the first and every subsequent period of twelve months.

8. The means of a pensioner shall for the purposes of the Act include:—

(a) the pension in respect of which the increase is claimed;

(b) any other pension, grant, allowance or annuity (including Old Age Pension) received by the pensioner;

(c) the annual value of any land or house property, subject to the deduction of ground rent, mortgage or loan interest, or other annual charge;

(d) interest or dividends on stocks or shares or on mortgages or other securities or on bank deposits;

(e) profits or wages of any trade, business profession, office employment or vocation, including overtime pay and war bonus, if any; and

(f) the annual value of any other benefit or privilege whatsoever enjoyed by the pensioner.

9. For the purposes of the Act, a pensioner shall be deemed to reside in the British Islands if his permanent place of abode is in the British Islands and if he continues to dwell therein during the time the increase is payable, provided that a pensioner shall not be disqualified from receiving the increase by reason only that he or she is only temporarily absent from the British Islands for a period not exceeding three months in any one year or for such further period as the Pension Authority may determine that he or she has been prevented from returning by causes beyond his or her control.

10. The pensioner shall, if and when required by the Pension Authority, produce any birth, death or marriage certificate or such other documentary evidence relative to the fulfilment of the statutory conditions as the Authority may consider necessary.

11. Where the Pension Authority is satisfied by the certificate of a justice of the peace or minister of religion, and of a duly qualified medical practitioner, that a pensioner is of unsound mind or otherwise incapable of making a declaration in the prescribed form, it may accept a declaration made on behalf of the pensioner by any person who appears to the Authority a proper person to represent the pensioner.

12. Any question which may arise in connection with the fulfilment by the pensioner of the statutory conditions or any of them shall be determined by the Treasury, whose decision shall be final.

WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all factories or parts of factories in which the bevelling of glass and processes incidental thereto are carried on.

- (a) the requirements in the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if

the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Monmouth and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Order be treated as a licence under that Order.

The foregoing caution has been rendered necessary owing to danger of sunken mines on the bottom. Attention is drawn to the cautionary note on the charts on this subject.

The areas defined above, with the exception of a portion of No. 19 and the whole of No. 21, are shaded on the accompanying chartlet, which is intended to provide a ready means of reference.

II. GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING MINES.

1. Mariners are warned that a certain number of mines have sunk without exploding. It is possible that some of these mines lying on the bottom may still be dangerous. Surface vessels navigating these areas should therefore, whenever possible, have a clear depth of at least six feet between their keels and the bottom when in the vicinity of shoal water or in the approaches to ports and harbours which were subjected to mining operations during the war.

2. In removing prohibitions upon vessels trawling, it is pointed out that a risk, although of a diminishing character, still exists.

The attention of all vessels trawling is drawn to the immunity which may be secured by the use of a suitable protective device to prevent mines entering the trawl.

As can be readily understood, it is not possible to predict for how long a period sunken unexploded mines remain dangerous, and consequently no unnecessary risk should be taken.

3. Mariners are notified that a small percentage of drifting mines are known to exist in a waterlogged condition, a fraction of which may be dangerous. This type of mine is hard to see, and special precautions are therefore necessary to ensure that a good lookout is kept.

The striking of low floating flotsam should be avoided.

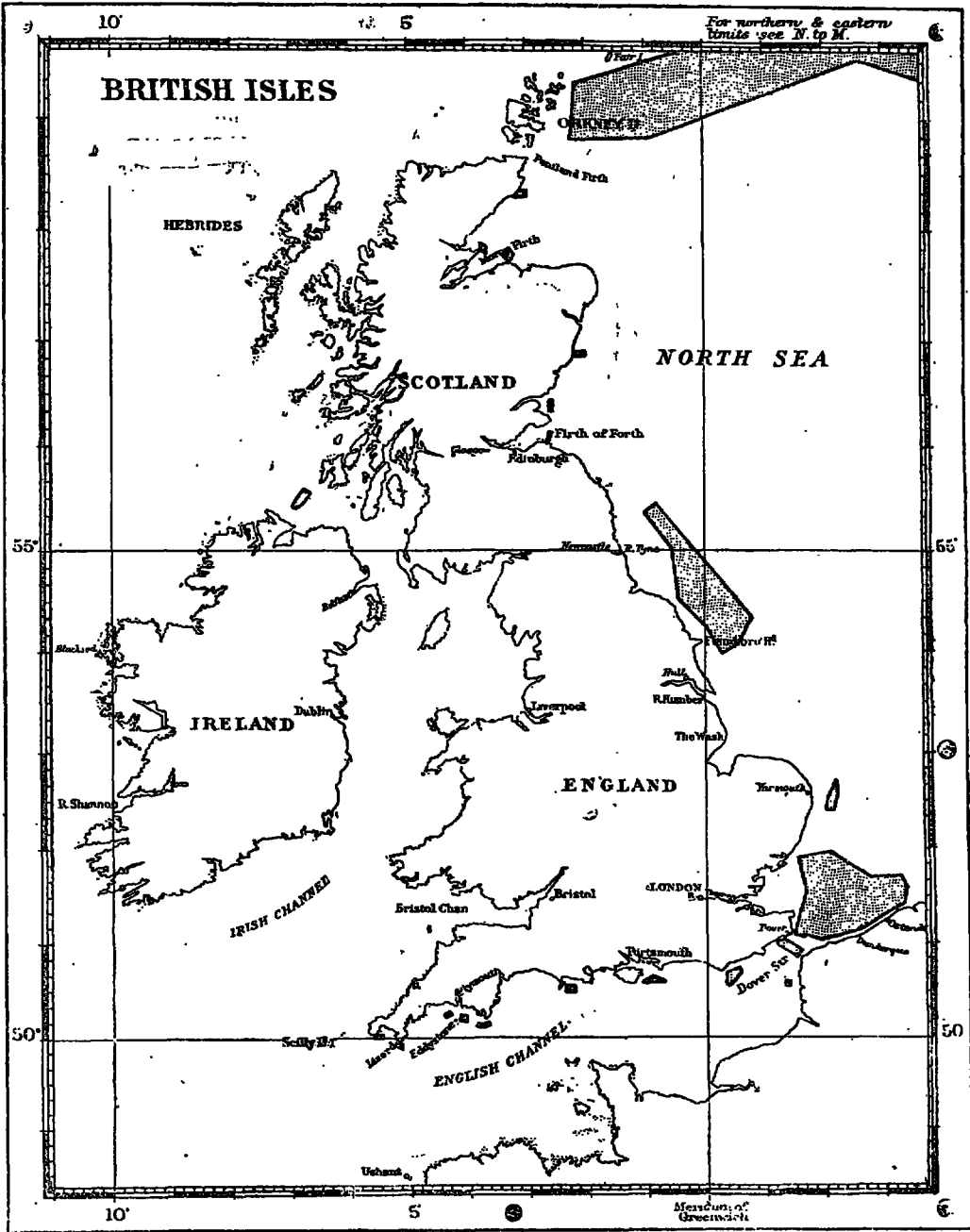
4. A serious accident has occurred to a vessel at anchor from the explosion of a drifting mine which came into contact with an obstruction on the hull.

When vessels have to anchor in areas where drifting mines may be found it is necessary that all obstructions should as far as possible be removed and gangways triced up before dark in order to minimise risk.

In regard to the great importance of the destruction of mines with a view to prevention of loss of life and shipping, attention of Masters is called to the necessity for strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter II., "Admiralty Instructions for British Merchant Ships," June 1919, and especially Section xiii., which includes the following:—

“ Whenever practicable, vessels should attempt to sink or destroy mines by gun or rifle fire, but no mine is to be sunk in any fairway where the depth of water at low water spring tides is less than 7 fathoms, except when a mine is drifting towards a vessel at anchor, and no vessel is to approach with-

RISCA ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

(The Production, Storage and Supply of Electricity by the Urban District Council of Risca within their District; the Breaking up and Interference with Streets and Railways; the Laying Down and Erection of Electric Lines, Wires, Posts and Apparatus; the Taking and Recovery of Rates and Charges; Incorporation of Acts, and other Provisions.)

The main roads from (1) Cwmcarn to Welsh Oak, (2) Cross Keys to Wattsville, North-road, Beecher-terrace, Carlton-terrace, Carlton-place, Beechwood-avenue, George-street, Duffryn-terrace, Hafod Tudor-terrace, Woodward-street, Waunfaur-road, Waunfaur-terrace, Salisbury-street, Bright-street, Cobden-street, Cobden-place, Tredegar-street (Newtown), Oak-terrace, Hall's-road-terrace, Gelli Unig-place, Mount Pleasant-road (Pontywain), Park-street, Park-road, Park-place (Cross Keys), Fields Park-terrace, Western-terrace, Medart-street, Sanson-street (Belvedere-terrace), Taylor-street, York-place (accommodation) road, Railway-street, Ebbw-street, Bridge-street, Phillips-street, Machen-street, Clarence-place, Dany-y-graig, Graig View, Wesley-place, Tredegar-street (Risca),

Lynes-road, Wellspring-terrace, Trafalgar-street, Francis-street, Isaf-road, Llanarth-street, Wyndham-terrace, Mill-terrace, Coronation-street, Maryland-road, Clyde-street, Hill-street, Priory-street, Mount Pleasant-road (Risca), Jacob's-drive, Park-place, Park-place Approach.

(b) Bridges—

The roadway on the bridge carrying the main road over the Pennar branch of the Great Western Railway (Monmouthshire Railway), the roadways on the seven bridges carrying the main road, Darran-road, Cwmbyr-road, Penyrhiw-road, Taylorstown-road, Moriah-road and Gelli-road over the Monmouthshire and Brecon Canal, the roadway on the bridge at Newtown carrying the main road from Cross Keys to Wattsville.

(c) Level crossings—

The level crossings on the Great Western Railway (Monmouthshire Railway) at King's Head and Darran; the level crossing on the siding from the Great Western Railway (Monmouthshire Railway) to Pontymister Steel and Tin Plate Works at Pontymister.

4. The name of the street in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order is as follows:—The main road from the boundary of the urban district of Risca at Cwmcarn to Mill-street, Pontymister.

5. To authorize the Council to take, collect and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of electricity and the sale or use of any machine, lamps, meters, fittings, or apparatus connected therewith, and to prescribe and limit the price to be charged for electricity.

6. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1919, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

7. To incorporate with the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable to cases where the undertakers are the local authority, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorized by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.
