PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows: ---

1. This Order may be cited as "The China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1920," and shall be read as one with "The China Order in Council, 1904" (hereinafter called the "Principal Order"), and with any Order amending the same.

2. Every person subject to the Criminal Jurisdiction of the Court, who has acted, is acting, or is about to act in a manner prejudicial to the public safety, or to the defence, peace or security of His Majesty's Dominions, or of any part of them, shall be guilty of a grave offence against the Principal Order, and

may, in addition to, or in lieu of, any other punishment, be ordered to give security for good behaviour or to be deported.

3. Every person subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the Court who prints, publishes, or offers for sale any printed or written newspaper or other publication containing seditious matter or has in his possession with intent to publish or distribute any such newspaper or other publication shall be guilty of a grave offence against the Principal Order, and may, in addition to, or in lieu of, any other punishment, be ordered to give security for good behaviour or to be deported.

4. In addition and without prejudice to any powers which the Court may possess to order the exclusion of the public from any proceedings, if; in the course of the trial of a person for an offence under this Order, application is made by the Prosecutor in the interests of national safety that all or any portion of the public should be excluded during any part of the hearing, the Court may make an order to that effect, but the passing of sentence shall in any case take place in public.

5. Article 2 (1) of "The China and Corea (Amendment) Order in Council, 1909," and the whole of "The China (War Powers) Order in Council, 1917," are hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not (a) affect the past operation thereof or any right, title, obligation or liability thereunder; or (b) interfere with the institution or prosecution of any legal proceeding thereunder.

6. This Order shall take effect on such day, not less than one month nor more than three months after it is first exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court at Shanghai, as the Minister shall by public notification appoint.

The day on which this Order so takes effect is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

For the purposes of this Article the Judge of the Supreme Court shall forthwith, on the receipt by him from the Minister in China of a certified printed copy of this Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that office, together with the said notification.

He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited until the commencement of this Order.

A copy of the said notification shall, as soon as practicable, be published at each of the Provincial Consulates in such manner as the Supreme Court may direct.

A certified printed copy of this Order shall also be affixed and exhibited in the public offices of the Provincial Court at Seoul, at the same time (or as near as circumstances admit) at which it is first exhibited at Shanghai.

Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any of such provisions.

Where this Order confers power to make any appointment, Rules, or Regulations, or to do any other thing for the purposes of this Order, that power may be exercised at any time after the passing of this Order, so, however, that any such appointment, Rules, or Regulations shall not take effect before the commencement of this Order.

And the Right HonourableGeorgeNathaniel, Earl Curzon of Kedleston, K.G., &c., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS. Effective as from 27th September, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, for the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade in Scotland, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, apd dated 31st March, 1920, having given due Notice on 20th May, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Timfe Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY HAVE FIXED General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and HAVE DECLARED the normal number of hours of work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that of hours of work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 17th September, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 27th September, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 3rd October, 1920.

Workers commencing employment in the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade for the first time, at and over the age of 19, may serve a period of six months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 8³/₄d. per hour. On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART II.

Piece-work Basis Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—Female Workers:

(a) All Female Workers other than Homeworkers, $9\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour.

(b) Home-workers, $9\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 9½d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

SECTION II.—Male Workers:

All Male Workers, 1s. 3¹/₂d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 3¹/₂d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:---

In any week, 46.

On any day (other than Saturday), 812.

Per Hour.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be five, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be eight-and-a-half.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piecework, in excess of the declared number of hours shall be as follows :—

1. For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

2. For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 46, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds $8\frac{1}{2}$, or, in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 46. Provided—

(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$.

(b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime, as set out above, shall apply in like manner, as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

` NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Female Learner is a worker who—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part V. of this Schedule by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female Learner on her first employment with-

out a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—The expression "Homeworker" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 31st March, 1920; that is to say, the making from any material of men's, women's or children's headgear, or the trimming thereof:—

Including :-

Warehousing, packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear;

But excluding :---

1. The casting and making of solid metal helmets;

2. The making of rubberised or oilskin headgear where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of other rubberised or oilskin articles:

other rubberised or oilskin articles; 3. The making of nurses' or servants' caps, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, or similar articles;

4. The making of field bonnets, sunbonnets, boudoir caps or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of dresses, nontailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, under-skirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen or similar articles;

5. The making of fur hats, where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of furs or furriers' skins into garments, rugs or similar articles;

6. The making of knitted headgear and the making of headgear from knitted fabrics where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabric;

7. Warehousing and packing of men's, women's and children's headgear and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made or trimmed on the premises.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of

contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without, prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates. Dated this twenty-third day of September, 1920.

(a) of Part I. of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

C. AS RESPECT: LEARNERS INCLUDED UNDER BOTH "A" AND "B" ABOVE.

(i) The General Minimum Time Rates for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 2¹/₄d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. of the Tables in Sections II. and IV. above, as if they had commenced at 14.

PART I.—SECTION IV.—Continued.

(ii) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due, in the case of the six-monthly advances, as from the first Monday in January and July of each year; and in the case of the twelve-monthly advances, as from the first Monday in January or July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided in both cases that she has been in the trade at least three months.

Workers commencing employment in the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade for the first time, at and over the age of 19, may serve a period of six months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at $8\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.

On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART II.

. Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—Female Workers.

(a) All Female Workers other than Home-workers, 9¹/₂d. per hour. . 1

(b) Home-workers, 91d. per hour. In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than $9\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour to an Ordinary worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

SECTION II.—Male Workers.

All Male Workers, 1s. $3\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. $3\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour to an Ordinary worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

Overtime Rates, Male and Female Workers $(All \cdot Ages).$

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows :

In any week, 46.

On any day (other than Saturday), 81/2.

On Saturdays, 4.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case, the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be 4, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall Ъе 84.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker whether engaged on time-work or on piecework, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:

Per hour

1. For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-anda-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter.

2. For Overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applic-

able, i.e., Time-and-a-Half. 3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 46, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where, on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds $8\frac{1}{2}$, or in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor) exceeds 4, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 46.

Provided-

(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$. (b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to

require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime, as set out above, shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Sunday" for "Satur-day."

Note.-The hours which Female Workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply :-

SECTION I.-A Female Learner is a worker who

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable

facilities for such learning; and (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

II.—The expression SECTION "Home-Worker" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION III.-The Retail Branch of the Trade is that branch of the Trade specified in Part V of this Schedule, in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

PART V.

The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 29th March, 1920 as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920; that is to say:-

Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of Non-Tailored Garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) non-tailored wearing apparel (other than handkerchiefs) worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex; or (b) boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex;

including:-

1. All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports-coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby-linen, or similar nontailored articles;

2. The making of field bonnets, sunbonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 1 above;

3. (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles

(b) The cleaning of any of the above-mentioned articles, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of such garments;

4. All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;

5. The following processes if done by achine :----Thread drawing, thread clipping, machine:top sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

6. Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the abovementioned articles;

but excluding:

(a) The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings, from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics;

(b) The making of gloves, spats, gaiters, boots, shoes, and slippers;
(c) The making of headgear, other than

the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above;

(d) The branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919;

(e) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(*f*) The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars.

(9) Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

And excluding also any processes or operations included in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.-The above General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subse-quent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II .--- The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the minimum rates.

KENT (FAVERSHAM DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows

-(1) The Area described in the Schedule 1. hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order."

(2) Part III of that Order is hereby applied to such parts of the Scheduled District which includes the said Prohibited Area, as are not within the Prohibited Area.

(3) The provisions of Article 2 of the Kent (Faversham District) (Foot - and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modification.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty.

3. This Order may be cited as the KENT (FAVERSHAM DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Kent (Faversham District) (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920, and the Kent (Faversham District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 2).

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

BERKSHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

¹ The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain District.

1.--(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Minister authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not rapply to--

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Ministry under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

2.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

. (iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, for isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Ministry or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

3.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or having been moved with a licence, or in accordance with the provisions of a notice, under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence or the provisions of the notice, an Inspector of the Ministry may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at the ex-

pense of the owner of the dog at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by the Ministry for such time as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient.

(2.) The owner of the dog shall from time to time as may be notified to the owner by the Ministry pay to the Ministry the expenses of the detention and isolation of the dog, and if the owner of the dog fails to comply with this provision the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient ; without further notice to the owner.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District 4. shall at all times

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage · muzzle ;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being-

. (i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to-

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of . cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.-(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the in-fection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Eveny dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6.-No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Ministry, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or per-mitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, 'the owner of the dog,' and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty. of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed-guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

"The Minister and the Ministry " means the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of

Animals Act, 1894. "Disease" me " diseased " means rabies, means affected with rabies, and "suspected" means suspected of rabies.

"Public place" includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall take immediate effect.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the BERK-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

(a) To authorize the Council to provide and distribute electrical energy within that part of the urban district of Caerphilly which lies to the south and east of a straight line drawn from the boundary of the urban district at the junction of the footpath leading from Pont-y-Pandy Farm with the Rhymney Raver to the point where such line intersects a footpath immediately to the west of Gwaun-Gledyr-Isaf Farm and to the north and east of a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point to the boundary of the said urban district at Bench Mark 351.2 on the road leading from Tongwynlais to Caerphilly Common; the said part of the said urban district being the area of supply for the purposes of the Caerphilly Electric Lighting Order, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as " the Order of 1913 ").

(b) To authorize the Council to exercise within the said part of the said urban district all powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy. /

(c) To empower or require the Council to purchase and the Caerphilly Electric Supply Company Limited to sell and transfer to the Council all rights, powers, privileges, mains, works and plant belonging to or held by the said Company as the undertakers for the purposes of the Order of 1913, and to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to any of such purposes, and to confirm any such agreement which may be or have been entered into.

(d) To authorize the Council to exercise all powers, rights and privileges so transferred to them and to be the undertakers for the purposes of the Order of 1913 or to repeal the said Order.

(e) To authorize the Council for the purpose of connecting the said part of the said urban district with the mains of the South Wales Electrical Power Distribution Company, to break up and interfere with and lay electric lines and works in, on or under the portion of the road leading from Caerphilly to Rudry which lies between the boundary of the said urban district and the end of Wernddu Cottages (including Van Terrace and Wernddu Row), the said portion of road being situate in the hamlet of Van, in the rural district of Llandaff and Dinas Powis.

2. The names of the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are: Cardiff-road, the Twyn, Castle-street, Market-street, Pontygwindy-road, Van-road, St. Martin's-road, and Mountain-road (part of).

3. The streets and parts of streets not repairable by a local authority which the Council propose to take powers to break up are: Pontygwindy-road, Bedwas-road, Nantgarwroad, Mountain-road, Cardiff-road (part of), Princes-avenue, Nantycalch-lane, Corbettcrescent, Street (unnamed) off Mountainroad, Goodrich-avenue, Northview-terrace, Street (unnamed) between Market-street. and Southern-street, Parc-avenue, Melville-terrace, Parcyfelin-street, Dolyfelin-street (part of), Caenant-road, Southern-street, Rectory-road, Street (unnamed) off Crescent-road.

4.
