The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years shall be 3d. per hour. Such Learners shall from the age of 14 be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above, all employment prior to that age being disregarded.

- (i) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.
- (ii) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I. of this Part of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

- (iii) No Female Learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under Section 1. of this Part of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.
- (iv) Any Female who has been previously employed in any branch of the tailoring trade shall, subject to the provisions of paragraph (iii) of this Sub-Section, count the whole period of such previous employment for the purpose of ascertaining the General Minimum Time-Rate at which she is to be paid.
