Provided that the General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 9s. per week of 48 hours, or 2½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the General Minimum Time-Rates shown in Column I. above, as if they had commenced at 14.

- (i) The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.
- (ii) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.
- (iii) A Female Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under this part of the Schedule upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below :—

Age of entering upon employment.	Conditions.
Under 15 years of age	The completion of not less than 3 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years
15 and under 16 years of age	The completion of not less than 2 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
16 and under 21 years of age	The completion of 2 years' employment.
21 years of age and over	The completion of 1 year's employment.
