TREASURY REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, RE-LATING TO CERTAIN POLICE PENSIONERS.

1. The pensioners to whom these rules apply are pensioners who on the sixteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty, were in receipt of pensions granted

under the Metropolitan Police Acts, 1829 to 1909;

under the Police Acts, 1839 to 1910;

under the Police (Scotland) Act, 1890, and the Police (Scotland) Act (1890) Amendment Act, 1910;

under the City of London Police Act, 1839, the City of London Police Act, 1874, and the City of London Police (Superannuation) Acts, 1889 and 1894;

under the Special Constables Act, 1914;

under the Police (Naval and Military Service) Acts, 1914 and 1915;

and in whose case the following statutory conditions are fulfilled :---

The pensioner must reside in the British Islands;

The pensioner must have attained the age of sixty years or have retired on account of physical or mental infirmity, or, in the case of a pensioner who is a widow and is in receipt of a pension payable in respect of the services of her
