7 Hereas We formerly received Information from the Governor and Company of Mer-chants of London Trading to the East Indies, That one Henry Every, Commander of the Ship called the Phansie alias Charles, of Fourty six Guns, and One hundred and thirty Men, had, under English Colours, committed several Asts of Piracy upon the Seas of India cr Persia, whereupon We Issued a Proclama-tum, hearing Date the Sewenteenth Day of July last, for the Taking and Apprehending the Stud Henry Every, and such other Persons as were with him in the said Ship, in Order to have them Punished as Pirates and Common Robbers upon the High Seas; And whereas We have finee the Issuing the faid Proclamation received further Information from the said Gover-nour and Company of Merchants Trading to the East Indies, That the said Henry Every hath changed his Name, and now goes by the Name of Henry Bridgman, and that James Cray, Thomas Summerson, Edward Kirwood, William Down, John Reddy, John Stroger, Nathaniel Pike, Peter Soanes, Henry Adams, Francis Frennier, Thomas Johnson, Joseph Dawson, Samuel Dawson, James Lanie John-Cost, Charles Follows, Follows Follows Lewis, John Sparks, Joseph Goss, Charles Falconer, James Murray, Robert Rich, John Willer, John King, Edward Savill, William Philips, Thomas Jope and Thomas Belisha, together with soveral others whose Names are not yet Discovered (amongst whom were Fifty two French-men, Fourteen Danes, and others of other Nations) were with the faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, in the said Skip Phansie, when the several Ads of Piracy were committed, and were Aiding and Affifting therein, and shared in the Plunder so by them Piratically taken, to the amount of One thousand Pounds a Man or thereabouts; And whereas We are Informed, That the faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, with several other Persons abovenamed, have, since they committed such AEEs of Piracy, left the said ship in the Island of Providence, and are arrived in Ireland in two small sloops, and have there adjusted themselves, some of which Persons remain there, and others are come into this Kingdom and the Kingdom of Scotland. Kingdom of Scotland, as two of their Accomplices, who are now Taken and in Custody, have Confessed and Diclared: We have therefore thought fit (by the At-wice of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council) to Issue this Proclamation, hereby Declaring, That the faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, together with the find several Persons above named, and others, Engish-men, Scotch-men, and Foreigners, to the numtwo of about One hundred anatherty, and Steal and Run away with the faild Ship from the Port of Corunna in Spain; and shar neither the faid Henry Every alias Hildgman, nor any of the Perfous abovenimed had

any Commission o- Authority from His Majesty to Command the faid Ship, or the Men therein; but that the faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, and the several other Persens above named, and juch others as were with them in the Jaid Ship, are Pirates and Robbers upon the High Seas. And We do hereby Charge and Command all His Majesty's Admirals. Captains, and other Officers at Sea, and all His Majesty's Governors and Commanders of any Fores, Castles or other Places in His Maj str's Plantations, and all other Officers and Persons what socret, to Seize and Appreciant the faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, James Cray, Thomas Summerton, Edward Kirwood, William Down, John Reddy, John Stroger, Nathaniel Pike, Peter Soanes, Henry Adams, Francis Frennier; Thomas Johnson, Joseph Dawson, Samuel Dawson, James Lewis, John Sparks, Joseph Goss, Charles Falconer, James Murray, Robert Rich, John Miller John King, Edward Swift, William Lohn Miller Miller Lohn Miller John Miller, John King, Edward Savill, William Philips, Thomas Jope, and Thomas Belisha, and fuch others as were with them in the faid ship (who may probably he known and discovered by the great Quantities of Gild and Silver of Foreign Coins which they have with them) in order that they may be brought to Justice, and Juster the just Punishment of the Law, as Pirmes upon the High Seas. And We do hereby further Declare, That in ease any of the Persons abou. named (except the Said Henry Every alias Bridgman) or any other Persons who were in the faid Ship with the faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, shall Discover the said Henry Every alias Bridgman, in any other of the Persons abovenamed, jo as they may to Seized and Taken, in order to be brought to Justice, in and they making such Discovery shall have His Majefly's Gracious Pardon for their Offinees. And Wa do hereby further Declare, That such Person in Persons, or any other Person or Persons who shall Discover to faid Henry Every alias Bridgman, so as he may be Seized or Taken, or shall be otherwise Instru-mental in Seizing the said Henry Every alias Bridg. man, he or they making Juch Discovery or Seizure, shall have the Reward of Five hundred Pounds prom. Jed in the faid former Proclamation, for the Discovery and Scizure of the faid Henry Every. And that in case any Person or Persons shall Discover any of the other Persons abovenamed, so as they may be Stimed or Taken, or shall be otherwise instrumental in Scients any of the Jaid Persons, he or they making such Discovery or Seizure, shall have a Reward of Pife; Pounds for every of the said Persons, whom he or they shall so Discover or Seize, which said several Sums of Five hundred Pounds and Fifty Pounds, the Lords Commif. sioners of His Majesty's Treasury are hereby Required and Directed to Pay accordingly.

Malaga, July 17, M.S. The 8th instant came into this Road the Canterbury and Romney Men of War, commanded by Capr. Lake and Capr. Lakes, having been as high as Aleme, to log for two in nch Men of War who appeared lately on these affs; in their return they met a Ship of 18 Guis and 36 Men, laden with Oil and Soap from the feitles, who pretends to be a Portuguise bound to tiben; but this is very improbable, having notions perfore the was taken, chased a-shore a small English. Letter, from Cesta, of the 6th inflant, tell us, That the Spaniards having carried two Mines as fac as the Enemies chief Attack, they blew up one of them the night before with very good Success, and soon after 700 Men made a Sally, commanded by Serjeant-Major Don Diego Pathies, who beat the Most from their Works, killing a great many, and obliging the rest to retire in much Diforder; which done, the Spaniards returned to their Place of Arms; about two hours after the Mesos appeared again in a great number, to recover the Ground they had loft; whereupon the Spaniards blew up the other Mine, with the like good f.ffect. In this Action the Spa-mards had 10 Men killed, and 27 wounded. The next day a Deferter came into the Town, and reported, That the Mears were very much discounged at the Lofs they have fustained, and the little Progress they have hitherto made in the Siege; and, That their Army consisted only of 5000 Mass, 3000 Blacks, and 500 Horse. And they write from the same Place of the 14th, That the Meers endeavoured on the 9th instant to repair their ruined Attack, but the Spaniards having another Mine ready at the Head of their Work, they blew it up, and defroyed many of the Enemy, which fo discouraged them, that they had not attempted any thing further when these Letters came away.

Belfast, August 3. His Majesty's Ship the Crown, Capt. Wade Commander, arrived in this Lough yesterday in the Evening, and brought in a French Privareer called the Goodwin of St. Malo, John Egyer Captain, of 12 Guns and 70 Men, taken on the Coast of Scotland; The French, during the Chase, threw their Guns over-board; The Prisoners are all landed here, and will be sent to Kinfale.

Dublin, Aug. 4. The Parliament mer yesterday according to their last Adjournment, and His Majesty's Pleasure being signified to both Houses, That they should further adjourn themselves to the 8th Day of September next; they accordingly adjourned till that time. This day the Presbyterian Ministers residing within this City, waited on the Lords Justices, and Congratulated their being placed in the Government of this Kingdom.
