WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court, and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court, and the consolidation of any two or more Districts, and the division of any District, and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The District of the County Court of Bedfordshire held at Ampthill, except the parishes detached therefrom by Paragraph 2 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Bedfordshire held at Bedford; and from the 31st day of December, 1920, the holding of the said Court at Ampthill shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court at Bedford, and the said Court held at Bedford shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

2. The parishes set out in the first column to the Schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 31st day of December, 1920, be detached from, and cease to form part of, the District of the said Court held at Ampthill, and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column thereof.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1921, and shall be read with the County Courts Districts Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas it is expedient to extend to the Isle of Man the Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920, revoking the Regulation herein-after mentioned:
