The following Statute made by the University of Cambridge, on the 20th day of October, 1920, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge made under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, 44 Vic., ch. 21, which amending Statute is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd section of the said Act, do hereby alter and amend the Statute made under the said Act in relation to our said University in manner following:—

Statute A, Chapter III.

By repealing the first paragraph of Section 3, intitled "Right of Voting," and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended first paragraph of Section 3:—

Right of Voting.

3. The following persons shall have the right of voting in the Senate, namely, the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, Doctors of Divinity, Law, Medicine, Science and Letters, Doctors of Music who before being admitted to their first degree have kept by residence at least nine terms, Doctors of Philosophy at the end of seven years from the beginning of their first term of residence, provided that not less than two years have elapsed since their creation, Bachelors of Divinity and Masters of Arts, Law, Surgery and Music.

New Certificate.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that the Managers of the Bradwall Training School have resigned the Certificate granted on the 19th October, 1916, in respect of the premises at Sandbach, Cheshire, and for the premises at Holmes Chapel, Cheshire, which were certified as part of the School on the 11th April, 1918, the Secretary of State has issued a new Certificate that the premises referred to in the Certificate dated 11th April, 1918, to be known in future as The Training School, Holmes Chapel, Cheshire, are fit to be a Reformatory School for the reception of such boys as may be sent thereto from time to time in pursuance of the provisions of the Children Act, 1908.

The Certificate, which bears date the 21st instant, provides that the number of inmates in the School at any one time, whether sent thereto in pursuance of the provisions of the Children Act or not, shall not exceed one hundred and twenty-five.
