TRADE BOARDS

THE TRADE BOARDS (BOOT AND FLOOR POLISH) ORDER, 1920.

Special Order, dated October 29, 1920, made by the Minister of Labour under section I. of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 (9 Edw. 7, c. 22) and 1918 (8 & 9 Geo. 5, c. 32), to the Boot and Floor Polish Trade.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under, and by virtue of section I. of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by section I. of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the sixth day of November, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Boot and Floor Polish Trade, that is to say:—

(1) the manufacture of boot and shoe polish or cream; blacking; dubbin; or floor polish or cream; and

(2) the manufacture of stain for leather or of polish for leather or furniture when carried on in association with or in conjunc-

tion with the manufacture of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) above;

including the following or similar operations when incidental to operations included in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

(i.) Checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;

(ii.) Filling, lidding, boxing, bottling, packeting, labelling;

(iii.) Packing, unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping;

but excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

THE TRADE BOARDS (OSTRICH AND FANCY FEATHER AND ARTIFICIAL FLOWER) ORDER, 1920. SPECIAL ORDER, DATED 2ND NOVEMBER, 1920, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR, UNDER SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, APPLYING THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 (9 EDW. 7, C. 22) AND 1918 (8 AND 9 GEO. 5, C. 32), TO THE OSTRICH AND FANCY FEATHER AND ARTIFICIAL FLOWER TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that Trade:

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other Statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the fifth day of November, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1. The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2. This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920.
