ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH NOVEMBER 1920.)

KENT (FAVERSHAM DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 9).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as

1.—(1) The Area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order."

(2) Part III of that Order is hereby applied to such parts of the Scheduled District which includes the said Prohibited Area as are not within the Prohibited Area.

(3) The provisions of Article 2 of the Kent (Faversham District) (Foot - and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 7) shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modification.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred

and twenty.

3. This Order may be cited as the Kenr District) FAVERSHAM . (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 9), and shall be read with the Kent (Faversham District) (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 7) and the Kent (Faversham District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 (No. 8).
