win, to join the Venetian Fleet.

Venuce, Aug. 10. The Senate have received Letters from the Captain-General, dated the 25th of June, when he was with the Venetian Fleet at Porto-Perto, expecting a great Convoy under the Command of Signior Duodo, and the Auxiliary Galleys, and intending so soon as they arrived, to put to Sea, and to direct his Course towards the Archipelago; leaving a sufficient Force to secure the Pass of the Ishmus of Corinth, in case the Turks should make any attempt to enter into the Morea with the Troops they have drawn together about The last Advices from the Levant say, the Turkish Fleet lay within the Dardanelli.

Turin, Aug. 11. The Truce agreed on between the Duke of Savoy and the French, which expires to morrow, is prolonged to the 2 oth of this month; In the mean time the Armies have changed their Camps; The Allies being moved nearer to the State of Milan, and the French nearer to Pignerol; The former decamped the 3d from Moncalier, and having passed the Po, came in two days marches to Chivas, where they are still encamped; The French Army marched the 7th from Volucra, and lie now encamped in 3 leparate Bodies, at Vigon, Pancallier, and Macello. The Duke of Savey has put all his Troops into Garisons; and endeavours all he can to have the Neutrality for Italy accepted by the Allies, which they feem not at all enclined to; The Emperor's Resolution in this Affair is expested by Count Mansfelt, who arrived last night in the Camp at Chivas in his way hither.

Madrid, Aug. 1. The Council or State has been often aftembled about the Affairs of Savoy, and feveral Experifes have been dispatched to Turin and Milan with their Refolution about carrying on the War in those Parts. It continues to be faid at Countrier the Open is with Child. The Fleta bound to Non-Spain failed the 23d of the last month from Codia with 6 Spanish Men of War.
