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Messina, July 16. N. S.

ON the 14th Instant arrived here the *Bolton* Galley, Capt. *Leonard Mencher*, in 18 days from *Cadiz*, bound to *Cyprus* and *Scanderoon*. We have advice, that the *Popes* and *Maltese* Gallies are passed by *Zant* in their Voyage towards the *Levant*, to join the *Venetian* Fleet.

Leghorn, Aug. 6. On the 31th past sailed hence 3 of the great *Dukes* Gallies, and 2 of *Genoux*, for *Messina*. The *Gosfricht*, Capt. *Appleby*, will sail to-morrow for *Scanderoon*.

Vence, Aug. 10. The Senate have received Letters from the Captain-General, dated the 25th of *June*, when he was with the *Venetian* Fleet at *Porto-Porto*, expecting a great Convoy under the Command of Signior *Duodo*, and the Auxiliary Gallies, and intending so soon as they arrived, to put to Sea, and to direct his Course towards the *Archipelago*; leaving a sufficient Force to secure the Pass of the *Isthmus of Corinth*, in case the *Turks* should make any attempt to enter into the *Morea* with the Troops they have drawn together about *Thebes*. The last Advices from the *Levant* say, the *Turkish* Fleet lay within the *Dardanelles*.

Turin, Aug. 11. The Truce agreed on between the *Duke of Savoy* and the *French*, which expires to-morrow, is prolonged to the 20th of this month; In the mean time the Armies have changed their Camps; The Allies being moved nearer to the State of *Milan*, and the *French* nearer to *Pignerol*; The former decamped the 3d from *Moncalier*, and having passed the *Po*, came in two days marches to *Chivass*, where they are still encamped; The *French* Army marched the 7th from *Volturna*, and lie now encamped in 3 separate Bodies, at *Vigon*, *Pancalier*, and *Macello*. The *Duke of Savoy* has put all his Troops into *Garisons*; and endeavours all he can to have the *Neutrality for Italy* accepted by the Allies, which they seem not at all inclined to; The Emperor's Resolution in this Affair is expected by Count *Mansfeld*, who arrived last night in the Camp at *Chivass* in his way hither.

Madrid, Aug. 1. The Council of State has been often assembled about the Affairs of *Savoy*, and several Expresses have been dispatched to *Turin* and *Milan* with their Resolution about carrying on the War in those Parts. It continues to be said at Court that the *Queen* is with Child. The Fleet bound to *New-Spain* sailed the 23d of the last month from *Cadiz* with 6 Spanish Men of War. The Bishop of *Salerno* is named to go Ambassador from this Crown to the Emperor, and will in a short time begin his Journey to *Vienna*. Don *Francisco de Velasco*, the new Viceroy of *Catalonia*, arrived the last week in the Spanish Camp at *Offenbrück*. The *French* Army is retired towards *Gerome*.

Cortona, Aug. 19. They write from *Malaga* of the 31th past, that a Dutch Privateer had brought into that Port two *French* Prizes, the one a *Sloop* laden with *Silk* and *Cotton* from *Constantinople*; and the other a Ship of

150 Tuns bound to *Barbary* to lade *Corn*, having on board 7000 Pieces of Eight. The Letters from *Lisbon* of the 7th Iy, His Majesty's Ship *Burlington*, with the Ships under her Convoy, was arrived at that Port. The *Dolphin* sailed the 8th from *Pigo* with several Vessels for *Lisbon*.

From the Imperial Camp under the Elector of Saxony near *Temelwaer*, Aug. 3. The Army having been encamped several days near *Aranks*, our Generals during that time received repeated Advices of the Grand Signior's march towards *Belgrade*, and dispatched Orders to all the Forces that were near enough to join us, to hasten their march for that purpose, it being resolved to endeavour by all means, to engage the Enemy in a Battle, and in order thereunto to advance towards this place as if 'twas intended to besiege it, thereby to oblige the *Turks* to come to its relief, and divert their march from *Peter-Waradin* and *Essecke*; accordingly on the 30th past we decamped from *Aranks*, and marched to *Felsh*, and on the 31th to *Biliff*, where we rested the first Instant; The same day the Auxiliary Troops of *Denmark* joined us, and we had advice that the *Brandenburgers* were come within 5 or 6 days march of us; The Parties that were sent out to get Intelligence returned with several Prisoners, who confirmed the Grand Signior's arrival in the Neighbourhood of *Belgrade*, and that he had ordered Bridges to be laid both over the *Danube* and the *Sava*. The 2d we continued our march; and came hither this day, encamping in two Lines almost within Cannon Shot of the Town. In the afternoon General *Rabutin* joined us with 8 Regiments of Horse and one of Foot from *Transylvania*, and we expect the *Brandenburgers* every day; when our Army will be composed of 50000 fighting Men; and by the best Accounts we receive of the Enemies Strength, they are not above 60000, great part of them being new raised and undisciplined Troops.

Vienna, Aug. 15. We are in great expectation of a Battle in *Hungary*; For by the last Letters from the Imperial Army dated the 6th in the morning, which arrived here some days ago by Express, we understand, that the Elector of *Saxony* having received Information that the whole *Turkish* Army had passed the *Danube* between *Semlin* and *Belgrade*, he held a Council of War, and in pursuance of what was there resolved, the Army decamped the 5th from *Temelwaer*, and marched to meet the Enemy, having sent away the heavy Artillery and Baggage with a sufficient Guard to *Chonad*. Letters from *Peter-Waradin* of the 6th Instant say, the *Turks* had sent a Detachment to attack the Forts of *Moravis*, but were repulsed; and that the *Turkish* Army passed the *Danube* the 5th of this month. The Emperor is sending an Ambassador to *Poland*, to be present at the approaching Election.

Frankfort, Aug. 22. The Confederate Army on the *Rhine* has been encamped for some time at *Rauchenberg*, during which there have only passed some Skirmishes between Parties; But it's said, that so soon as we hear the Landgrave of *Hesse*, who returns with his Troops from the *Muse* is come as far as *Coblenz*, we shall pass the *Rhine*; Prince *Lewis* having ordered a great many Boats to be provided in the mean time. The *French* Army marched the 18th from *Munshheim* to *Linsingen*, where they still continue.

Cologne, Aug. 24. The *German* Troops under the command of the Landgrave of *Hesse* are advanced as far as *Bon*, where they rest this day, and to-morrow will continue their march towards *Coblenz*, in order to pass the *Moselle*. A Body of *French* Troops march likewise towards the *Moselle* under command of the Marquis of *Harcourt*.
