WINCHESTER AND DISTRICT (PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain Area.

1. No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto. Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through the Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the Area.

Seizure of Dog in case of Default.

2.—(1) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order, an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at a place of detention selected by the Ministry for such time as the Ministry think necessary or expedient.

(2) If the owner does not, within such period as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient and notify the owner, claim the dog from the Ministry and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice the dog shall be moved to a place

of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(3) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog, and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Offences.

4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If a person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, allows a dog to stray he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall take immediate effect.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the WINCHESTER AND DISTRICT (PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.
