

and the several Convoy from *Africa*; as likewise
the late Capt. *Claudius*, who brought with him
a French Merchant Ship of 200 Tuns, 14 Guns,
and 20 Men, bound from *Moselle* to *Martinico*,
laden with Wine, Oil, and other Commodities
proper for the *West Indies*. The same day arrived
here a Vessel in two days, from *S. J.*, the Men
say, that the *Algerines* are entered into the
Empire of *Morocco* Territories, and have defeated
one of the *Spaniards*, and that *Nuly Imael* is
thrusting himself into the Field with all the
Power he can get together. The 6th sailed
hence three Dutch Privateers to the North. The
Fame and *Reindeer* went out again on the 7th.
A Ship came in from *Vigo* in 10 days, who
left the Turkey Ships safe arrived there.

Wednesday Aug. 22. The Queen of *Spain* was ta-
ken ill on the 7th instant, and has since had
a violent Fever, with repeated Convulsion Fits,
which has brought her into so dangerous a Con-
dition, that there are little hopes of her Re-
covery. The two Expresses that came from *S. J.*
and *Vigo*, were sent back on Friday last, with
Orders to the Marquis de *Lagune*, about carrying
on the War on that side. The King of *Spain* has
been indisposed with a tertian Ague, but is
very well again.

London, September 1. They advise from *Lisbon*
of the 20th past. That all the Ships from *Vigo*,
Oporto, and 6 from *Cadiz*, having joined there,
they sailed the day before for *England*; and the
Sailors returned for *Cadiz*. The 25th past came
into this Port a Dutch Privateer called the *Simone*,
who two days before saw a Fleet of about 40 sail
to *Lagos* from *Cape Oregan*, standing to
the *Westward*; most of them great Ships, one of
which, of about 50 Guns, gave him Chase for
some time. The Letters from *Ministry* of the 20th
Inst. say, the Queen of *Spain* was very ill, and her Re-
covery doubtful; and that they had advice by
a Vessel come to *Cadiz*, that the Turkey Fleet
was scattered at *Algiers*.

London, Sept. 23. Some days ago *Nathaniel*
Perry, one of the Pyrates mentioned in the late
Proclamations, was taken near *Bolkeret*; several
of the Gang are seized, and all imagined
concerning their Discovering and Securing
the rest to stand as we in this Kingdom. The
Letters of the 12th of the 23rd instant give an
account, that on the 19th arrived there 40 sail
of Merchant Ships from *Virginia* bound to *London*,
River Thames, *Humber*, *Humber* and *Mersey*, His
Ministry say, the *Humber* and *Mersey*,
who run along this Coast, few them safe into
that part of the Fleet, being about 20
ships, sail directly for *Bristol* with the *Ships*
and *Boats* of their Convoy, who came with
them from *Virginia* on the 10th of July. The
23rd arrived at *Kingsgate* a small Sloop from *Virginia*,
bound to *London*. And the *Surveyor* of *London* is
advised as follows; they came both out with the
Fleet before mentioned.

London, Sept. 28. Some days ago was Pub-
lished here a Proclamation for Apprehending of
Bury, and the rest of the Pyrates, mentioned in
a late Proclamation in *England*, and offering a
Reward of 500 Pounds Sterling to such as shall
take *Bury*, and 50 Pounds for every one of the
other Pyrates.

Fulham, Aug. 29. Yesterday arrived here the
Spanish Ambassador from the *Guzza*. The *Jelly*

is come in with some Vessels from the *Westward*
Plimouth, Aug. 30. On the 26th instant came
into this Port the Frenchman of *Barn Apple* from
Algiers, who was retaken from the French, and
sent in by the *Military Advice-Boat*. The same
day a Dutch Fly-Boat of 16 Guns and 400 Tuns,
called the *Arms of Limburgh*, was sent in, being
taken by His Majesty's Ship the *Mary*. This day
arrived here a Dutch Caper from *Gabes*.

Weymouth, Aug. 31. On Saturday last came
a Vessel from *Guernsey*, the Master whereof said
that about 8 days ago His Majesty's Ship the
Portland brought in there a French Privateer of
six Guns, and 45 Men; and the *Experiment* had
brought in a French Prize of 250 Tuns, laden
with Wine and Brandy; She was towed by a
French Man of War of 200 Guns, who upon sight
of the *Experiment* and *Lynn* Frigates, cast her off.
Pembroke, Sept. 1. My Lord *Berkely* with his
Fleet under his Command, came to *Spithead* yester-
day from *Torbay*. *Weymouth*, Sept. 1. The Parliament met this day
and was by Commission further Prorogued to the
day of October next.
