

and the former Convoy from *Albion*; as likewise
the *St. Charles* Captain *Johnson*, who is thought with him
a French Merchant Ship of 200 Tons, 14 Guns,
and 60 Men, bound from *Marfales* to *Martinico*,
laden with Wine, Oil, and other Commodities
proper for the *West-Indies*. The same day arrived
here a *French* in two days from *Sa. B.* the Men
report that the *Algerines* are entered into the
Empire of *Algeria* Linnates, and have defeated
one of the *French* and that *Muly Ismael* is
thus appearing himself into the Field with all the
Force he can get together. The 6th sailed
hence for the *Dutch* Privateers to the North. The
France and *Spain* went out again on the 7th.
A Ship came in from *St. Jago* in 10 days, who
left the *Turkey* Ships safe arrived there.

Madrid, Aug. 22. The Queen of Spain was taken
ill on the 7th instant, and has since had
a violent Fever, with repeated Convulsion Fits,
which has brought her into so dangerous a Con-
dition, that there are little hopes of her Re-
covery. The two Expresses that came from *St. Jago*
and *St. Jago*, were sent back on Friday last, with
Orders to the *Marquis de Legunza*, about carrying
on the War on that side. The King of Spain has
been indisposed with a Tertian Ague, but is
very well again.

some time. The Letters from *Madrid* of the 22th

was at *St. Jago*.

London, Sept. 20. Some days ago *Nathaniel*
Pike, one of the *Pyrate*s mentioned in the late
Proclamation, was taken near *Salisbury*; several o-
thers of the same Crew are seized, and all imagi-
ned to be taken for Discovering, and Securing
the same, as we in this Kingdom. The
Letters of the 25th of the 25th instant give an
account, that on the 19th arrived there 40 Sail
of Merchant Ships from *England* bound to *London*,
