

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH DECEMBER 1920.)

KENT (WINGHAM DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The Kent (Wingham District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall be read and have effect as if the area described in the Schedule hereto were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Scheduled District described in that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the KENT (WINGHAM DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Kent (Wingham District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty.

SCHEDULE.

District released from restrictions.

A district comprising:—

In the administrative county of Kent:—

The borough of Folkestone, the petty sessional division of Home, the parishes of Dunkirk (including its detached part), Elmsted, Stelling, Stelling Minnis, Elham, Lyminge, Stowting, Newington, Acrise, Paddlesworth, Hawkinge, Cheriton, and Sandgate, and the detached part of the parish of Hernhill.

And also comprising:—

The city and county borough of Canterbury.

CORN PRODUCTION ACT, 1917. AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

VARIATION OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE VALUE OF POTATOES AS A BENEFIT OR ADVANTAGE THROUGHOUT ENGLAND AND WALES.

The values at which the provision by an employer for a worker employed by him of Potatoes (being one of the benefits and advantages specified in the Order of the Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), dated the 6th September, 1918) may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of any minimum rates of wages fixed under the above Act have been varied by the said Board (after due consideration of the determinations of the District Wages Committees under the said Order) so as to provide that in the areas hereunder mentioned such values shall as from the 13th December, 1920, be as follows:—
