GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920.

Notice of Application by the Wakefield Gaslight Company for an Order under Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Wakefield Gaslight Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers") have applied to the Board of Trade under the provisions of Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for an Order providing for—

(a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Undertakers to supply gas of any particular calorific value and the substitution therefor of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas; and

(b) the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Undertakers by substituting for the standard price per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised with an addition to meet increases in the costs and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas by the Undertakers since 30th June, 1914, a standard price per therm (*i.e.*, 100,000 British Thermal Units).

The standard price now authorised in respect of the supply of gas by the Undertakers is three shillings per 1,000 cubic feet, and the price which the Undertakers have asked the Board of Trade to substitute for this price in accordance with paragraph (b) above is one shilling and four and three-fifth pence per therm.

Electricity Commission.

BOURNE END AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

1. The Bourne End and District Electricity Corporation Ltd. (hereinafter called "the Company"), whose address is at Trafalgar Buildings, 1, Charing Cross, London, S.W. 1, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1919, for a Special Order for the following objects:—

(a) To authorize the Company to generate and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within the following area (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply"), that is to say:—

The parishes of Wooburn, Little Marlow and Hedsor in the rural district of Wycombe and the urban district of Marlow, all in the county of Bucks, and so much of the parishes of Cookham and Bisham in the rural district of Cookham in the county of Berks as lies to the north of an imaginary straight line drawn in a westerly direction from a point on the eastern boundary of the parish of Cookham due east of the northern boundary of Slow Grove Island to a point on the western boundary of the parish of Bisham situate 1,300 feet to the south-west of the most northerly corner of Temple House, Bisham.

(b) To repeal the powers conferred upon the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Maidenhead by the Maidenhead Electric Lighting (Extensions) Order, 1904, of supplying electricity in such part of the parish of Cookham as is included in the area of supply;

(c) To enable the Company to maintain, alter, improve, renew, work and use the generating station and other works belonging to them, together with all necessary buildings, works and appliances connected therewith on the lands hereinafter described, namely:—

All that piece or parcel of land containing in the whole 1,126 square yards or thereabouts situate at Bourne End in the parish of Wooburn in the county of Bucks and forming the south-eastern part of the Inclosure Nod. 525 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map, Buckinghamshire, Sheet XLVII, 14, Berkshire, Sheet XVII, 14 (Second Edition, 1899), which said piece of land has a frontage on the south to the Inclosure Nod. 483 on the said Ordnance Map of 110 feet.

(d) To authorize the Company to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy.

2. The names of the roads in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are:—

(a) In the parishes of Wooburn and Little Marlow:—

The main road from Bourne End to Marlow from Riversdale through Bourne
