## APROCLAMATION.

rife in Barthole Hereas We have received Information upon Oath, That the Persons hereafter mentioned have Committed High Treason, in Clipjing and Counterfeiting the Current Coin of this Kingin, for which several Warrants for High Treason have hm Issued out against them, but they have withdrawn thmselves from their usual Places of Abode, and are be fuddenly its ful from Justice: We have therefore thought fit, by the divice of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, to Isue this Proclamation; and We do hereby Commend and Require all His Majefty's loving Subjects to Discover, Take and Apprehend Captain William Winwur of Dymock in the County of Gloucester, he is a sell lufty big Man, of a brown Complex on, of about Five and forty Years of Age, he speaks loud and hoarse; his Servant, of a middle Statute, a black swarthy Complexion, short black curled Hsir, about Five and twenty Years old, he speaks in sk Welsh Tone; William Barnes a Saddler without th Southgate-street at Gloucester, he is a short thick Man, with a very red Face, about Fifty Years old; William Trigg of Mitchel-Dean in the Said County, black short thick Man, between Twenty and Thirty narrold, with a black curled Head of Hair; Willism Cutler of Mitchel-Dean afortsaid, a tall thin black Man, pale Visaged, between Thirty and Forty, Skn through one of his Hands, wears his own Hair; Richard Beard of Dymock aforefaid, a middle-fixed dim, about Eight and twenty Years old, brown Hair, gus a little Splay-footed, with his Toes out; William Broadly of Mitchel-Dean aforefaid, Black-Smith, a sullafly Man of a brown Complexion, a little Disfi-guid with the Small Pox, about Thirty Years old, his em Hair thin and lank; John Tanner of the Parish of Box in the County of Wilts, a very little short thin Man, between Thirty and Forty, of a brown Complexion, wears his own Hair; Thomas Tanner, Brother of the faid John, of the Parish aforesaid, somewhat taller, and of the same Complexion with his Brother, where-ever they may be found, and to carry them before the next Japice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate, who is hereby Required to Commit them to the next Gaol, there to remain till they shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And We do hereby Require the faid Justice or other Magistrate immediately to give notice thereof to His Majesty's Privy Council, or one of His Majesty's Prinsipal Secretaries of State. And We do hereby Publish and Declare to all Persons who shall Conceal the Persons abvenanced, or any of them, or be Aiding or Affifting in the Concealing of any of them, or Furthering their El cape, that they shall be Proceeded against for such their

Offence with the utmost Severity according to Law. And for the Encouragement of all Persons to be Diligent and Careful in endeavouring to Apprehend and Discover any of the Said Persons, We do hereby further Declare, That whefoever shall Discover and Apprehend she said William Wintour shall have the Reward of One hundred Pounds; And whosever shall Discover and Apprehend the said Anthony shall have the Reward of Fifty Pounds; and whosever shall biscover and Apprehend any of the other Persons abovenamed, and shall bring them before some Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, as aforesaid, shall have and receive as a Reward the Sum of Twenty Pounds; which said several Sums the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are hereby Required to Pay accordingly, over and above the Sum of Forty Pounds, Appointed to be Paid for the Apprehending and Convicting any Person Guilty of Clipping or Coining, by an Act of Parliament made in the Sixth and Seventh Tears of His Majesty's Reign. And We do hereby further Declare in case the said Anthony Shall Surrender himself to any Justice of the Peace, or other Chief Magistrate, and shall make a full Confession and Discovery of his knowledge of any Persons being Guilty of Clipping or Counterfeiting the Current Coin of this Kingdom, he shall have His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon for his Said Officie.

Csdiz, August 12. N.S. On the 2d of this Month Captain Kirkton, Commander of the Ro. chester Man of War, took off Cape Spartell a French Ship of 250 Tun, and 20 Guns, bound from Marseilles to Martinico, laden with all sorts of Necessaries for that Island.

Warsaw, August 29. The General Dyet of Poland met here this day, and after having been at Mass in the Cathedral Church, as is usual, the Senators, and Deputies from the feveral Pro-vinces, repaired to the Places appointed in the Palace, for their separate Consultations, and the latter fell immediately upon the Consideration of a fit Person to be their Marshal or Speaker; Several were proposed, and supported by their Friends with fo much Earnestness, that they have not yet been able to agree upon any one to perform that Office. When this is done, the next Point that will be debated, is, Whether the Queen-Dowager, and the Princes her Sons shall be defired to withdraw out of this City during the Sitting of the Dyet; and upon this Subje& there is like to be a great deal of Heat among the Deputies: But the Queen, to quiet them in the mean time, has declared, That though she did not think her felf obliged to comply with what was ordered by some of the Provincial Dyers, yet that she will have all the regard that can be de-
