SHREWSBURY AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The Shrewsbury and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall apply only to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and that Area, subject to the modification contained in Article 2 of the first mentioned Order, shall continue to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

3. This Order may be cited as the SHREWSBURY AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921; and shall be read
