3. To exclude from incorporation some or all of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, or to incorporate the same with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order, and to extend them to the area of supply under the Order of 1894.

4. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1919, and enactments incorporated therein, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

5. It is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time in such roads as may be required by the Electricity Commissioners.
