Portsmeuth, Decemb. 13. Yesterday was forced into Spitthead by fiels of weather, the John and Bonadventure from the Canaryes, bound for London, having in the Channel met with leveral Merchant Ships, much difordered by the feverity of the late ill weather, but we hear not of any one perished.

The Milford having been upon the dry Dock to re-fits was on Friday last launched, and may in few dayes be ready to put out to Sea ; and the Nonfuch may in little time be launched off the Stocks.

Lisbonne, Nov. 29. Genoua, Dec. 5. The Princefs Fregat intends this night to put to fea (if the weather permit) on her way for Spain, Sir Thomas Allen, with the Fleet under his command, was a fornight fince at Cagliari on his way for Tunis. Yefterday were elected 5 Senators for the Government of this City for the two years next enfuing, viz. Co'pgrez Decemb. 8. Paris, Decemb. 19. On Satuiday last his Majesty ordered all the principal ditectors of the Companies of Trade, to attend him at the Louure, where a Counsell of Commerce was held, and the Chief President of the Parliament of Paris, being called in, was acquainted with his Majestics pleasure. That the second payment of Moneys for the Encouragement of Trade be forthwith advanced.
