considerable Cities were by its suden violence laid even with the ground, and all or most of the inhabitants buried in the Ritines, above Six thousand persons perishing in the first of them; and above one thousand eight hundred in the latter, and in all the adjacent Cities it has raged with extraordinary fury, destroying and ruining their buildings, killing many of the people, the rest having been forced to quiethe Towns, and take up their habitations in the fields.

The Elector of Mayence intends to continue this winter at Wurtsbourg, attended in all his motions with a strong guard of Horse and Foot.

Paris, Decemb, 19. From Rochelle we are advised of the arrival of five Ships, belonging to the West-India Company from America, richly laden, to the value of 500 thoufand Livres, a great part of their Cargo confisting of Hides, bringing with them leveral forts of Animals taken by them. in the Southern parts of America, intended for a Present to his Majesty. The five Men of War intended for the West-Indies, under the Command of the Count d' Estrees, Vice-Admiral, are not yet put to Sea, but 'tis believed may sud-denly receive their sayling Orders. The Sieur de Augeron, who was first expected, being lately arrived from those parts, from whom we look for a full account of the State of the French Plantation in the Isle of St. Domingo, whereupon fuller Instructions may be given to the Count d'Efirees for their better Establishment.

On Saturday last his Majesty ordered all the principal ditectors of the Companies of Trade, to attend him at the Louure, where a Counsell of Commerce was held, and the Chief President of the Parliament of Paris, being called in, was acquainted with his Majesties pleasure, That the fecond payment of Moneys for the Encouragement of Trade

be forthwith advanced.

At the same time was given in to his Majesty, a List of all such as had refused to contribute towards the advance of Trade. His Majesty was pleased infull Counsel to express himself to be difficished with them, as persons that have difobliged him; Of which number is faid to be the Parliament of Rennes, who have passed a Decree to the contrary.

The City of Rouss being in great measure restored to health, hath made its Addresses, defiring that their Trade may be again opened by the first of January, and according thereunto some persons are sent to make an Inquiry upon the

place into the present Condition of that City.
From Bruffels we are informed, that the Constable of Cafille, Governour of the Spanish Netberlands, has ordered 6000 of his forces to march into Franche Comte for the guard and fecurity of that Province, and to supply the room of the Lorrain forces which are re-called by the Duke, to be employ'd in his wars against the Prince Elector Palatine, if the megoriations which are on foot for a peace, take no effect.
