Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the existing provision for (1) the avoidance of loss from fire, including the regulations dealing with construction of buildings, dangerous processes and fire risks generally, the arrangements for inquiry and research and for furnishing information and advice to public authorities and others on matters relating to fire prevention, and (2) the extinction of outbreaks of fire, including the control, maintenance, organization, equipment and training of Fire Brigades in Great Britain, and to report whether any, and if so what, changes are necessary, whether by statutory provision or otherwise, in order to secure the best possible protection of life and property against risks from fire, due regard being paid to considerations of economy as well as of efficiency:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Sir Perceval Maitland Laurence (Chairman); Sir Joseph Ernest Petavel; Sir Sampson Sladen; Sir Vincent Henry Penalver Caillard; Sir Maurice Fitzmaurice; Arthur Lewis Dixon; Guy Symonds; Vivian Leonard Henderson; James Thomas Burns; Hedley Peters and Henry Edward Stilgoe to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry:

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; to call for information in writing; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any one or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

## FRANCE: AERODROMES AND METEOROLOGICAL STATIONS.

(362741/20.)

It is hereby notified:

Notice to Airmen No. 98 of 24th September, 1920, is amplified as follows:—

## 1. AERODROMES.

ST. INGLEVERT.—The road forming the Eastern boundary of the aerodrome is marked by a line of small stakes one metre high, at intervals of 25 metres, each stake being surmounted by a vertical white disc of 50 cms. diameter.

## 2. AIRSHIP STATIONS.

MAUBEUGE.—A warning has been issued to French aviators that the surface of this Station being intersected by shallow trenches and ridges is very dangerous for heavier-than-air craft. It should not therefore be used even for emergency purposes, its appearance from the air being very deceptive.

*Note.*—Maubeuge is a Military Station, and is not included in the list of aerodromes at which permission has been granted to British civil pilots to land.

## RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

### INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

In conformity with the provisions of section 1 of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, ch. 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiry of forty (40) days from the date of this Gazette to make rules as shown below, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by section 1 of the Indian Civil Service (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1915 (5 & 6 George V, ch. 87).

### RULES.

#### INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

##### APPOINTMENTS (IN INDIA) OTHERWISE THAN BY OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Rules for the appointment during the year 1921 to the Indian Civil Service otherwise than by the annual Open Competition (which will still continue to be held) of Natives of India and Burma. It will rest with the Government of India to determine whether candidates are qualified in respect of nationality, age, character, and education, as defined in the following Regulations:—

1 (a) Every candidate must be either a British subject or a ruler or subject of any State in India in respect of whom the Governor-General in Council has made a declaration under section 96 (a) of the Government of India Act, 1915, as amended by section 3 of the Government of India (Amendment) Act, 1916.

(b) If the candidate (being a British subject) or his father or his mother was not born within His Majesty's Dominion and allegiance, the father must at the time of the candidate's birth have been a British subject or the subject of a State in India and still be (or have continued to be until his death) a British subject or a subject of such State.

2. Every candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1896, and on or before the 1st August, 1900.

3. Every candidate must be of a good moral character and sound physique.

4. Every candidate must produce satisfactory evidence that he possesses a degree in Arts or Science of an Indian or British University, or

has passed the examination for the higher diploma of the Mayo College, Ajmer, or the diploma of the Aitchison Chiefs' College at Lahore.

5. Any person who possesses the qualifications prescribed in the foregoing rules is eligible to apply for nomination, whether he be already in Government service or not.

6. Every candidate, being a British subject, must submit to the local Government of the Province in which he resides an application in the form annexed to these rules, together with the fee prescribed in that form.

7. Every candidate, being a ruler or subject of a State in India who is qualified under Rule 1, must submit his application through the Durbar of the State to the local Government of the Province in which he wishes to serve.

8. Candidates will be nominated by the Government of India on the recommendation of the local Government.

9. Candidates nominated by the Government of India will be accepted by the Secretary of State for India in Council as Selected Candidates for the Indian Civil Service, subject to any further enquiries that he may find it necessary to institute, and will be required to undergo a period of probation for two years at a College or University in the United Kingdom approved by the Secretary of State. Selected candidates will be entitled to free passages to and from the United Kingdom and will be paid an allowance at the rate of £200 sterling per annum during the period of probation, subject to good conduct. At the end of this period of probation they will be tested by the Civil Service Commissioners, or by an authority in India specially empowered in this behalf, in such subjects as may be prescribed, and in riding. They will not be appointed to the Indian Civil Service until they have been certified to have fulfilled these tests.

10. Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through persons of influence will disqualify him for appointment. Spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not themselves acquainted with the candidate's work at School, or at the University, or otherwise, will be disregarded.

On account of urgency the Secretary of State for India in Council has, under section 2 of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, ch. 66, made the above Rules to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules to continue in force until rules have been made in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of that Act.

ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3).**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Detention of Animals moved out of Landing Place.*

1. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1921 or any Order amending it, cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed after the twenty-ninth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, may be moved from any Landing Place with a licence of an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there slaughtered within a period of ten days after the date of their arrival at such place of detention. Whilst in the place of detention animals moved with a licence under this Order shall not be allowed to come into contact with other animals.

(ii) Animals moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Order.

A copy of every licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention specified in the Licence is situate, who shall take steps to enforce the conditions of the Licence.

*Offences.*

2. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order or is not isolated or slaughtered as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the animal, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3).

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
