PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice, dated 28th May, 1920, and effective under Orders of the Minister of Labour, dated 29th December, 1919, and 26th May, 1920, in respect of certain classes of Female Workers, and that they Propose to Fix General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers and to Vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given) certain minimum rates in their application to Male Apprentices in the Bone Brush Section of the trade at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice dated 18th October, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 15th October, 1920, the proposed minimum rates of wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.
