LIGHT RAILWAYS ACTS, 1896 AND 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade in Great Britain, as specified in the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920, namely:—

1. The preparation throughout of ostrich or fancy feathers from the natural condition to the finished feather product.
2. The making of artificial flowers, fruit, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods from paper, wax, textile materials, porcelain, glass, plaster, metal composition, rubber, leather, raffia, cellophane and similar materials.
3. The preservation of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns, seeds or pods.
4. The making of hats of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when made in, or in association with, or in conjunction with, any business or establishment, or branch or department or work-room mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.
5. The making of feather garments (including neckwear and muffs); feather trim-
