MEASLES, GERMAN MEASLES AND WHOOPING COUGH: NOTIFICATION IN CERTAIN DISTRICTS.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH FEBRUARY 1921.)

MIDLAND COUNTIES (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contractions of Scheduled Districts.

1. The Midland Counties (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921 (No. 3) shall apply only to the Areas described in the Schedule to this Order, and those Areas subject to the modification contained in Article 3 of the first-mentioned Order, shall continue to be Prohibited Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the MIDLAND COUNTIES (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Areas.

1. An Area comprising the city of Birmingham.
2. An Area comprising the parish of Sheldon, in the administrative county of Warwick.
3. An Area comprising:—

In the Administrative County of Gloucester:

The parish of Adlestrop and that portion of the parish of Evenlode which lies within the following boundary, namely:—Commencing at the point where the parish boundary meets the boundary of the parish of Adlestrop at the river Evenlode, and proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction along that river to Stock Bridge, thence in an easterly direction by the roadway crossing the railway to its junction with the Adlestrop and Evenlode Road, thence in an easterly direction along the foot-path to a point where it crosses the north boundary of the parish of Adlestrop to the south side of Horn Farm, Evenlode, and thence along the parish boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point of commencement.

4. An Area, in the administrative county of Northampton, comprising such portions of the parishes of Edgcote and Chipping Warden as lie within the following boundary, namely:—Commencing at the parish boundary of Edgcote near Trafford Bridge, thence in southerly, south-easterly, and north-westerly directions along the parish boundary to its junction with the parish boundary of Chipping Warden, at the River Cherwell; thence to its junction with the road between Wardington and Chipping Warden, near Hay's Bridge; thence in north-easterly, easterly, and southerly directions along the main road through the village of Chipping Warden to the point of commencement.
