Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. After Paragraph (XXI) of Article one of the principal Order there shall be inserted the following Paragraph:—

"(XXI (a)). The Comptroller-General of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks shall have power and shall be deemed to have had power, as from the coming into force of the Treaty, in cases where patents and designs

are revived under the provisions of Article 307 of the Treaty, to impose such conditions as he may deem reasonably necessary for the protection of persons who have manufactured or made use of the subject-matter of such patents or designs while the rights had lapsed."

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1921, and the principal Order, the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1920, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1921.

WHEREAS by the Restoration of Order in Ireland Act, 1920, it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty in Council that owing to the existence of a state of dis-

order in Ireland the ordinary law is inadequate for the prevention and punishment of crime or the maintenance of order, His Majesty in Council may issue regulations under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the restoration and maintenance of order in Ireland, and as to the powers and duties for that purpose of the Lord Lieutenant and the Chief Secretary, and of members of His Majesty's Forces and other persons acting on His Majesty's behalf, and in particular regulations for the special purposes thereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 13th day of August, 1920, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations under the said Act:

And whereas it was provided by the regulations so made that the principal regulations and the supplemental regulations therein mentioned might be cited collectively as the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations:

And whereas it was provided by the regulations so made that copies of the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations, printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office, might be printed, containing the principal regulations and the supplemental regulations, and that in such print the supplemental regulations other than the Second Schedule should be inserted after Regulation 66 of the principal regulations, and should be numbered accordingly:

And whereas the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations have been printed and numbered in the manner authorized and directed by the said regulations:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that owing to the present state of disorder in Ireland, the ordinary law is inadequate for the prevention and punishment of crime and the maintenance of order:

And whereas the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments shall be made in the said regulations:—

1. Regulation 57 shall be amended as follows:—

The following words shall be added at the end of the fourth paragraph thereof:—

“and the statement on oath of any witness which is included in the summary may be given in evidence on the trial of the person by court martial, if it is proved that the witness has been forcibly and unlawfully carried away, in the like circumstances and manner in which it could be given in evidence on such trial if it were proved that the witness was dead.”

2. Regulation 69 shall be amended as follows:—

In sub-section (4) for the words “on a trial by a civil court with a jury” there shall be substituted the words “if they were statements on oath of witnesses included in a summary of evidence taken by or by the direction of the competent naval or military authority.”

3. The following new regulation shall be inserted after regulation 72:—

"72A. On the trial by court martial of a person alleged to be guilty of a crime or of an offence against these regulations, the statement on oath of any witness which is included in the summary of evidence taken by or by the direction of the competent naval or military authority to whom the case has been referred for investigation shall be admissible in evidence, if it is proved that the statement was signed by the witness and taken in the presence of the accused and that the witness is dead or has been forcibly and unlawfully carried away or is unable to attend owing to sickness or injuries. The foregoing provisions shall be in addition to, and not in substitution for, the provisions of any Act, regulation or rule of law as to the admission of evidence."

4. Regulation 79A shall be amended as follows:—

In sub-section (3), for the words "sub-sections (1) and (2)" there shall be substituted the words "sub-sections (2) and (3)."

5. Copies of the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations, printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after the date of this Order, may be printed, with the additions and variations directed to be made by this Order, and with the paragraphs and regulations numbered in accordance with such direction, and those regulations shall be construed as if they had at the date of this Order been made with such additions and variations.

**UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE
(COURSES OF INSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.***

The Minister of Labour, after consultation with the Board of Education and the Scottish Education Department, hereby makes the following Regulations in pursuance of Sections 7 and 35 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, and all other powers in that behalf:—

Short title and commencement.

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Courses of Instruction) Regulations, 1921, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Interpretation.

(2) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires or admits,

The expression "The Minister" means the Minister of Labour.

The expression "the Act" means the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

The expression "insured contributor" has the same meaning as in the Act.

Minister to approve courses of instruction.

(3) For the purposes of Section 7 (1) (v.) of the Act the Minister may approve, subject to the concurrence of the Board of Education or the Scottish Education Department, such courses of instruction as he thinks fit.

Insurance Officer may require applicant for unemployment benefit to attend course of instruction: considerations to be taken into account.

(4) An Insurance Officer may require any insured contributor who is an applicant for unemployment benefit (or for payment in respect of unemployment from an Association of employed persons with which an arrangement has been made under Section 17 of the Act, after consultation with the Association concerned) to attend an approved course of instruction at such times and places and for such periods as the Insurance Officer may specify.

Provided that in determining whether such an insured contributor shall be required to attend an approved course of instruction and, if so, at what times and for what periods the Insurance Officer shall take into account:

(a) the distance of the insured contributor's place of residence from the place where the approved course of instruction is to be held;

(b) any available evidence tending to show that the insured contributor is attending a genuine educational course other than a course of instruction approved by the Minister under Regulation 3.

Insured contributor undergoing instruction not obliged to sign unemployed register.

(5) An insured contributor shall be exempt from the obligation to attend at a Local Office and sign the unemployed register as a condi-

tion of qualification for or receipt of unemployment benefit upon any day on which the insured contributor duly attends an approved course of instruction, in accordance with the Insurance Officer's requirements.

Insured contributor undergoing instruction not entitled to unemployment benefit in certain circumstances.

(6) In the event of an insured contributor being excluded from an approved course of instruction on the ground of misbehaviour or unpunctuality or failing, without sufficient cause, to attend for the full period specified by the Insurance Officer, he shall not be deemed to have satisfied the statutory conditions for the receipt of unemployment benefit on any day of such exclusion or failure, unless after consideration of any special circumstances it has been otherwise determined in accordance with Section 11 of the Act or Regulation 7 of the Unemployment Insurance (Associations) Regulations, 1920.

Insured contributor undergoing instruction deemed to be available for work.

(7) An insured contributor who is attending an approved course of instruction shall not be deemed to have proved that he is unable to obtain suitable employment if he fails to present himself at the Local Office for interview by an Officer of the Ministry of Labour in connection with a vacancy for employment, when so required, and if so required, he shall be deemed to be available for work notwithstanding the fact that he is attending an approved course of instruction.

Regulation only operative in Great Britain.

(8) These Regulations shall be operative only in Great Britain.
